4 Subject: Agriculture; dairy; technical corrections

5 Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to make technical and housekeeping  
6 changes to existing dairy laws.

7 An act relating to miscellaneous agricultural subjects

8 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

11 Sec. 1. 6 V.S.A. § 2672 is amended to read:

12 § 2672. DEFINITIONS

13 As used in this part, the following terms have the following meanings:

14 \* \* \*

15 (7) "Milk": Unless preceded or succeeded by an explanatory term,  
16 means the pure lacteal secretion of a type of dairy livestock listed in this  
17 subdivision. Such milk may be standardized by the addition of pure, fresh  
18 skim milk or cream as defined by regulation. The secretary may, in  
19 accordance with chapter 25 of Title 3, promulgate a list of food grade additives  
20 which may be added to milk. The additives used in milk sold in retail

1 packages shall be conspicuously stated in descending order of volume on the  
2 label of the package in a manner approved by the secretary.

3 (A) “Cows’ milk” is the colostrum-free, pure, lacteal product of  
4 healthy ~~eows~~ cattle which contains not less than 11.50 percentum of total milk  
5 solids (to which nothing has been added or taken away). Cows’ milk sold in  
6 retail packages shall contain not less than 3.25 percent milk fat, and not less  
7 than 8.25 percent nonfat milk solids. ~~The secretary may, in accordance with~~  
8 ~~chapter 25 of Title 3, promulgate a list of food grade additives which may be~~  
9 ~~added to cows’ milk. The additives used in cows’ milk sold in retail packages~~  
10 ~~shall be conspicuously stated in descending order of importance on the label of~~  
11 ~~the package in a manner approved by the secretary. Such milk may be~~  
12 ~~standardized by the addition of pure, fresh skim milk or cream as defined by~~  
13 ~~regulation.~~

14 (B) “Goats’ milk” is the colostrum-free, pure, lacteal product of  
15 healthy dairy goats which contains not less than 10 percentum of total milk  
16 solids (to which nothing has been added or taken away). Goats’ milk sold in  
17 retail packages shall contain not less than 2.5 percent milk fat and not less than  
18 7.5 percent nonfat milk solids. ~~The secretary may, in accordance with chapter~~  
19 ~~25 of Title 3, promulgate a list of food grade additives which may be added to~~  
20 ~~goats’ milk. The additives used in goats’ milk sold in retail packages shall be~~  
21 ~~conspicuously stated in descending order of importance on the label of the~~  
22 ~~package in a manner approved by the secretary. Such milk may be~~

1 ~~standardized by the addition of pure, fresh skim milk or cream as defined by~~  
2 ~~regulation.~~

3 (C) "Sheep's milk" is the colostrum-free, pure, lacteal product of  
4 healthy dairy sheep which contains no less than 11.50 percent of total milk  
5 solids (to which nothing has been added or taken away).

6 (D) "Water buffalo's milk" is the colostrum-free, pure, lacteal  
7 product of healthy dairy water buffalo which contains no less than 11.50  
8 percent of total milk solids (to which nothing has been added or taken away).

9 (8) ~~"Imitation dairy products" are those products containing no milk~~  
10 ~~which by their texture, flavor, color, packaging, or other characteristics, could~~  
11 ~~be confused by consumers with established and defined dairy products or are~~  
12 ~~sold or offered for sale as substitutes for milk or fluid dairy products.~~ "Raw  
13 milk" means unpasteurized milk that may be cooled and filtered but is  
14 otherwise unprocessed.

15 (9) ~~"An imitation dairy product handler" is a person, firm,~~  
16 ~~unincorporated association or corporation engaged in the business of buying,~~  
17 ~~selling, packaging or processing imitation dairy products for sale within or~~  
18 ~~without the state of Vermont.~~ "Raw milk product" means a milk product that  
19 is unpasteurized but may have other limited processing as approved by the  
20 agency and that is only available for sale to licensed milk handlers for further  
21 processing.

1           ~~(10)~~ “An imitation dairy product handler’s license” is a license issued by  
2 the secretary which authorizes the licensee to carry on the business of an  
3 imitation dairy products handler.

4           ~~(11)~~(10) “Retail package of dairy product ~~or imitation dairy product~~” is  
5 a package to be sold to a consumer.

6           ~~(12)~~(11) “Dairy products” are milk, or the products derived therefrom,  
7 which conform to the appropriate legal standard or definition for the specific  
8 product as defined in this part and regulations made under this part.

9           ~~(13)~~ “Fluid dairy products” are milk and fluid dairy products derived  
10 from milk, including cultured products, as defined by regulations made under  
11 this part.

12           ~~(14)~~(12) “Licensed technician” is a person who has demonstrated by  
13 appropriate tests, to the satisfaction of the secretary, that he or she has the skill,  
14 experience, ability, and integrity to perform tests that are used as a basis for  
15 payment or acceptance of dairy products ~~or imitation dairy products~~, and who  
16 holds one or more licenses issued by the secretary authorizing ~~him~~ the person  
17 to carry on one or more of these activities.

18           ~~(15)~~(13) “Approved dairy laboratory” is any place or premise which has  
19 been inspected and approved by the secretary or, if not located in Vermont, is  
20 approved and listed by the National Conference on Interstate Milk Shipments  
21 in accordance with the most recent evaluation of milk laboratories as published  
22 by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service,

1 Food and Drug Administration, where tests are made on milk; or dairy  
2 products; ~~or imitation dairy products~~, to determine the quality or acceptance of  
3 the products. The laboratory shall meet recommendations as set forth in the  
4 latest edition of APHA “standard methods for the examination of dairy  
5 products.” The secretary may terminate approval for cause.

6 ~~(16)~~(14) “Adulteration” means an adulterated dairy product ~~or~~  
7 ~~adulterated imitation dairy product~~ containing noxious, unwholesome, or  
8 deleterious material, preservative, drugs, or chemical in a quantity injurious to  
9 health; or which does not conform to the definition of the product; or which is  
10 not produced, processed, or distributed according to the provisions of this part.

11 ~~(17)~~(15) “Commission” means the Vermont milk commission as  
12 constituted in section 2922 of this title.

13 ~~(18)~~(16) “Charitable uses” means the distribution of milk among poor  
14 and needy persons without charge or compensation therefor.

15 ~~(19)~~(17) “Distributor” means any person who sells milk ~~or imitation~~  
16 ~~dairy products~~ to consumers within the state, except those who sell milk ~~or~~  
17 ~~imitation dairy products~~ for consumption on the premises. ~~A producer or~~  
18 ~~person who delivers or sells milk to a distributor only shall not be deemed a~~  
19 ~~distributor.~~

20 ~~(20)~~(18) “Market” means any area designated by the board as a natural  
21 marketing area.

1           ~~(21)~~(19) “School lunch milk” means milk sold, offered for sale, or  
2 distribution at school buildings, grounds, or other places used for school  
3 purposes.

4           ~~(22)~~(20) “Person” means individuals, corporations, partnerships, trusts,  
5 associations, cooperatives, and any and all other business units or entities.

6           ~~(23)~~(21) “Additional definitions”: The secretary may, (after due notice  
7 and public hearing) in accordance with chapter 25 of Title 3, promulgate,  
8 amend, or rescind definitions of other dairy products ~~and imitation dairy~~  
9 ~~products~~ including modified milk, dairy processes, and rules relating to  
10 specially trained personnel.

11           ~~(24)~~(22) “Drug” or “drugs” mean:

12           (A) articles recognized in the official United States Pharmacopeia,  
13 official Homeopathic Pharmacopeia of the United States, or official National  
14 Formulary, or supplement thereto; and

15           (B) articles intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation,  
16 treatment or prevention of disease in man or other animals; and

17           (C) articles (other than food) intended to affect the structure or any  
18 function of the body of man or other animals; and

19           (D) articles intended for use as a component of any articles specified  
20 in subdivision ~~(24)~~(A), (B), or (C), of this ~~section~~ subdivision (22), but not  
21 including devices or their components, parts, or accessories.

1           ~~(25)~~(23) Definitions and standards of milk products not herein defined  
2 shall be those established by federal agencies and published in the Code of  
3 Federal Regulations.

4           ~~(26)~~(24) “Vermont fresh milk” means milk consisting entirely of fresh  
5 milk produced in Vermont.

6           ~~(27)~~(25) “Northeastern fresh milk” means milk consisting entirely of  
7 fresh milk produced in Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New  
8 York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire,  
9 or Maine.

10           (26) “National Conference on Interstate Milk Shipments” means the  
11 national nonprofit organization of that same name, or its successor in interest,  
12 that deliberates and votes on proposals submitted by individuals from state or  
13 local regulatory agencies, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, the U.S.  
14 Department of Agriculture, producers, processors, and consumers who have an  
15 interest in the safety of dairy products.

18           A milk plant or handler shall not dispense or deliver fluid dairy products  
19 other than whey for livestock feed including poultry except under regulations  
20 as may be promulgated by the secretary.

3 (a) The secretary, in accordance with chapter 25 of Title 3, shall

6 but not limited to: labeling, weighing, measuring and testing facilities,

14 through a marketing service owned by the cooperatives, and the secretary shall  
15 not issue a handler's license, unless the handler furnishes the secretary a good  
16 and sufficient surety bond, executed by a surety company duly authorized to  
17 transact business in this state in an amount equal to 50 percent for all species  
18 other than cattle, and 100 percent for cattle, of the maximum amount due all

5 required by the secretary, the secretary may suspend the license of the handler  
6 until he or she complies with the secretary's orders. The secretary shall report  
7 to the attorney general the name of any handler doing business in this state  
8 without a license or after suspension of its license by the secretary and the  
9 attorney general shall forthwith bring injunction proceedings against the  
10 handler. Renewals of bonds specified in this section shall be furnished the  
11 secretary 60 days before the effective date of the bond. If the handler fails to
