

1 TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

2 The Committee on Agriculture and Forest Products to which was referred
3 Senate Bill No. 70 entitled “An act relating to the delivery of raw milk at
4 farmers’ markets” respectfully reports that it has considered the same and
5 recommends that the House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended by
6 striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the
7 following:

8 Sec. 1. 6 V.S.A. § 2776 is amended to read:

9 § 2776. DEFINITIONS

10 In this chapter:

11 (1) “Consumer” means a customer who purchases, barter for, receives
12 delivery of, or otherwise acquires unpasteurized milk ~~from the farm or~~
13 ~~delivered from the farm~~ according to the requirements of this chapter.

14 * * *

15 Sec. 2. 6 V.S.A. § 2777 is amended to read:

16 § 2777. STANDARDS FOR THE SALE OF UNPASTEURIZED (RAW)
17 MILK

18 (a) Unpasteurized milk shall be sold directly from the producer to the
19 consumer for personal consumption only and shall not be resold.

20 (b) Unpasteurized milk shall be sold only from the farm on which it was
21 produced except when delivery is arranged in conformance with section 2778

1 of this chapter. Unpasteurized milk shall not be sold or offered as free samples
2 at any location other than on the farm on which the milk was produced.

3 (c) Unpasteurized milk operations shall conform to reasonable sanitary
4 standards, including:

5 (1) Unpasteurized milk shall be derived from healthy animals which are
6 subject to appropriate veterinary care, including tuberculosis and brucellosis
7 testing and rabies vaccination, according to accepted testing and vaccinations
8 standards as established by the agency. Test results and verification of
9 vaccinations shall be posted on the farm in a prominent place and be easily
10 visible to customers.

11 (2) The animal's udders and teats shall be cleaned and sanitized prior to
12 milking.

13 (3) The animals shall be housed in a clean, dry environment.

14 (4) Milking equipment shall be of sanitary construction, cleaned after
15 each milking, and sanitized prior to the next milking.

16 (5) Milking shall be conducted in a clean environment appropriate for
17 maintaining cleanliness.

18 (6) The farm shall have a potable water supply which is sampled for
19 bacteriological examination according to agency standards every three years
20 and whenever any alteration or repair of the water supply has been made.

1 (7) If an animal is treated with antibiotics, that animal’s milk shall be
2 tested for and found free of antibiotics before its milk is offered for sale.

3 (d) Unpasteurized milk shall conform to the following production and
4 marketing standards:

5 (1) Record keeping and reporting.

6 (A) A producer shall collect one composite sample of unpasteurized
7 milk each day and keep the previous 14 days’ samples frozen. The producer
8 shall provide samples to the ~~agency~~ Agency if requested.

9 (B) A producer shall maintain a current list of all customers,
10 including addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses when available.

11 (C) The producer shall maintain a list of transactions for at least one
12 year which shall include customer names, the date of each purchase, and the
13 amount purchased.

14 (2) Labeling. Unpasteurized (raw) milk shall be labeled as such, and the
15 label shall contain:

16 (A) The date the milk was obtained from the animal.

17 (B) The name, address, zip code, and telephone number of the
18 producer.

19 (C) The common name of the type of animal producing the milk
20 (~~e.g., such as~~ cattle, goat, sheep) or an image of the animal.

1 (D) The words “Unpasteurized (Raw) Milk. Not pasteurized. Keep
2 Refrigerated.” on the container’s principal display panel, and these words shall
3 be clearly readable in letters at least one-eighth inch in height and prominently
4 displayed.

5 (E) The words “This product has not been pasteurized and therefore
6 may contain harmful bacteria that can cause illness particularly in children, the
7 elderly, and persons with weakened immune systems and in pregnant women
8 can cause illness, miscarriage, or fetal death, or death of a newborn.” on the
9 container’s principal display panel and clearly readable in letters at least
10 one-sixteenth inch in height.

11 (3) Temperature. Unpasteurized milk shall be cooled to 40 degrees
12 Fahrenheit or lower within two hours of the finish of milking and so
13 maintained until it is obtained by the consumer.

14 (4) Customer inspection and notification.

15 (A) Prior to selling milk to a new customer, the new customer shall
16 visit the farm and the producer shall provide the customer with a the
17 opportunity to tour of the farm and any area associated with the milking
18 operation. ~~Customers are encouraged and shall be permitted~~ The producer
19 shall permit the customer to return to the farm at a reasonable time and at
20 reasonable intervals to ~~re-inspect~~ reinspect any areas associated with the
21 milking operation.

1 (B) A sign with the words “Unpasteurized (Raw) Milk. Not
2 pasteurized. Keep Refrigerated.” and “This product has not been pasteurized
3 and therefore may contain harmful bacteria that can cause illness particularly
4 in children, the elderly, and persons with weakened immune systems and in
5 pregnant women can cause illness, miscarriage, or fetal death, or death of a
6 newborn.” shall be displayed prominently on the farm in a place where it can
7 be easily seen by customers. The lettering shall be at least one inch in height
8 and shall be clearly readable.

9 (e) Producers selling ~~12.5~~ 87.5 or fewer gallons (~~50~~ 350 quarts) of
10 unpasteurized milk per ~~day~~ week shall meet the requirements of subsections (a)
11 through (d) of this section and shall sell unpasteurized milk only from the farm
12 on which it was produced. A producer selling ~~12.5~~ 87.5 or fewer gallons of
13 unpasteurized milk may choose to meet the requirements of subsection (f) of
14 this section, in which case the producer may deliver in accordance with section
15 2778 of this ~~chapter~~ title.

16 (f) Producers selling ~~12.6~~ 87.6 to ~~40~~ 280 gallons (50.4 to 160 quarts) of
17 unpasteurized milk per ~~day~~ week shall meet the requirements of subsections (a)
18 through (d) of this section as well as the following standards:

19 (1) Inspection. The ~~agency~~ Agency shall annually inspect the producer’s
20 facility and determine that the producer is in compliance with the sanitary
21 standards listed in subsection (c) of this section.

1 (2) Bottling. Unpasteurized milk shall be sold in containers which have
2 been filled by the producer. Containers shall be cleaned by the producer
3 except that the producer may allow customers to clean their own containers
4 only if each customer's container is labeled with the customer's name and
5 address and the customers use their own containers. Producers shall ensure
6 that only clean bottles are filled and distributed.

7 (3) Testing.

8 (A) A producer shall have unpasteurized milk tested twice per month
9 by a U.S. Food and Drug Administration accredited laboratory. Milk shall be
10 tested for the following and the results shall be below these limits:

11 (i) ~~Total~~ total bacterial (aerobic) count: 15,000 cfu/ml (cattle and
12 goats);

13 (ii) ~~Total~~ total coliform count: 10 cfu/ml (cattle and goats);

14 (iii) ~~Somatic~~ somatic cell count: 225,000/ml (cattle); 500,000/ml
15 (goats).

16 (B) The producer shall assure that all test results are forwarded to the
17 ~~agency~~ Agency, by the laboratory, upon completion of testing or within five
18 days of receipt of the results by the producer.

19 (C) The producer shall keep test results on file for one year and shall
20 post results on the farm in a prominent place that is easily visible to customers.
21 The producer shall provide test results to the farm's customers if requested.

1 (4) Registration. Each producer operating under this subsection shall
2 register with the ~~agency~~ Agency.

3 (5) Reporting. On or before March 1 of each year, each producer shall
4 submit to the ~~agency~~ Agency a statement of the total gallons of unpasteurized
5 milk sold in the previous 12 months.

6 (6) Prearranged delivery. Prearranged delivery of unpasteurized milk is
7 permitted and shall be in compliance with section 2778 of this ~~chapter~~ title.

8 (g) ~~The sale of more than 40 gallons (160 quarts) of unpasteurized milk in~~
9 ~~any one day is prohibited.~~ [Repealed.]

10 Sec. 3. 6 V.S.A. § 2778 is amended to read:

11 § 2778. DELIVERY OF UNPASTEURIZED (RAW) MILK

12 (a) Delivery of unpasteurized milk is permitted only within the ~~state~~ State
13 of Vermont and only of milk produced by those producers meeting the
14 requirements of subsection 2777(f) of this chapter.

15 (b) Delivery shall conform to the following requirements:

16 (1) Delivery shall be to customers who have:

17 (A) visited the farm as required under subdivision 2777(d)(4) of this
18 title; and

19 (B) purchased milk in advance either by a one-time payment or
20 through a subscription.

1 (2) Delivery shall be directly to the customer;

2 (A) at the customer's home or into a refrigerated unit at the
3 customer's home if such unit is capable of maintaining the unpasteurized milk
4 at 40 degrees Fahrenheit until obtained by the customer;

5 (B) at a farmers' market, as that term is defined in section 5001 of
6 this title, where the producer is authorized to sell milk.

7 (3) During delivery, milk shall be protected from exposure to direct
8 sunlight.

9 (4) During delivery, milk shall be kept at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or lower
10 at all times.

11 (c) A producer may contract with another individual to deliver the milk in
12 accordance with this section. The producer shall be jointly and severally liable
13 for the delivery of the milk in accordance with this section.

14 (d) Prior to delivery at a farmers' market under this section, a producer
15 shall submit to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets, on a form
16 provided by the Agency, notice of intent to deliver unpasteurized milk at a
17 farmers' market. The notice shall:

18 (1) include the producer's name and ~~license number~~ proof of
19 registration;

20 (2) identify the farmers' market or markets where the producer will
21 deliver milk; and

1 (3) specify the day of the week on which delivery will be made at a
2 farmers’ market.

3 (e) A producer delivering unpasteurized milk at a farmers’ market under
4 this section shall display the license required under subdivision 2777(f)(4) of
5 this title on the farmers’ market stall or stand in a prominent manner that is
6 clearly visible to consumers.

7 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

8 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
