


GIV Long-Term Outcomes Study

In early 2012 the Governor's Institutes of Vermont began work on an alumni study. Alumni who attended one or more Governor's Institutes between 1983 and 2006 were asked to take a survey about the impact the programs had and whether that impact had lasting effects on their lives. For many respondents, GIV broadened their sense of what was possible in terms of their education and future.

Did GIV make you more aware of exciting/interesting career or educational opportunities?






