

Dear Karen,

I am writing to invite you to partner with NADCP and the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) on a project designed to improve criminal justice outcomes by applying evidence-based practices at each stage in the criminal justice system, from arrest through reentry. The project would involve bringing together key policymakers, stakeholders and practitioners from your jurisdiction for a two-day summit to identify gaps in local services and develop an action plan to improve the justice system in your community. The focus will be on the implementation of concrete and practical strategies to improve outcomes and reduce costs.

In October 2013, NADCP convened the Executive Directors and thought leaders from 41 leading national practitioner organizations to address hands-on issues in the implementation of criminal justice reforms. The *Doing Justice Executive Summit* brought together representatives of the police, sheriffs, judges, prosecutors, defense lawyers, pretrial services officers, probation and parole officers, substance abuse and mental health treatment providers, jail and prison officials, crime victims, and the faith community [see attached list of participating organizations]. The goals of the Summit were to reach a consensus about fundamental principles for effective reform and identify evidence-based practices proven to work at each stage in the criminal justice process.


