

1 TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

2 The Committee on Judiciary to which was referred House Bill No. 62  
3 entitled “An act relating to prohibiting the handheld use of a portable  
4 electronic device while driving” respectfully reports that it has considered the  
5 same and recommends that the bill be amended by striking out all after the  
6 enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1095b is amended to read:

8 § 1095b. HANDHELD USE OF PORTABLE ELECTRONIC DEVICE ~~IN~~

9 ~~WORK ZONE~~ PROHIBITED

10 (a) Definition. As used in this section, “hands-free use” means the use of a  
11 portable electronic device without use of either hand ~~and outside the immediate~~  
12 ~~proximity of the user’s ear~~, by employing an internal feature of, or an  
13 attachment to, the device.

14 (b) Use of handheld portable electronic device ~~in work zone~~ prohibited.  
15 A person shall not use a portable electronic device while operating a moving  
16 motor vehicle ~~within~~ on a highway work zone in this State. The prohibition of  
17 this subsection shall not apply ~~unless the work zone is properly designated~~  
18 ~~with warning devices in accordance with subdivision 4(5) of this title, and shall~~  
19 ~~not apply:~~

20 (1) to hands-free use, or to use of the device to activate or deactivate  
21 hands-free use; or

1           (2) when use of a portable electronic device is necessary to  
2           communicate with, or for communication among, law enforcement or  
3           emergency service personnel under emergency circumstances;

4           (3) to use of an ignition interlock device, as defined at 23 V.S.A. § 1200.

5           (c) Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a traffic violation  
6           and shall be subject to a penalty of not less than \$100.00 and not more than  
7           \$200.00 ~~upon adjudication of~~ for a first violation, and of not less than \$250.00  
8           and not more than \$500.00 ~~upon adjudication of~~ for a second or subsequent  
9           violation within any two-year period.

10          (d)(1) Operators of commercial motor vehicles shall be governed by the  
11          provisions of 23 V.S.A. chapter 39 (Commercial Driver License Act) instead  
12          of the provisions of this chapter with respect to the handheld use of mobile  
13          telephones, and texting, while operating a commercial motor vehicle.

14          (2) A person shall not be issued more than one complaint for any  
15          violation of this section, section 1095a of this title (junior operator use of  
16          portable electronic devices), or section 1099 of this title (texting prohibited)  
17          that arises from the same conduct.

18          Sec. 2. 23 V.S.A. § 2502 is amended to read:

19          § 2502. POINT ASSESSMENT; SCHEDULE

20          (a) Any person operating a motor vehicle shall have points assessed against  
21          his or her driving record for convictions for moving violations of the indicated

1 motor vehicle statutes in accord with the following schedule: (All references  
2 are to Title 23 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.)

15 § 1095a. JUNIOR OPERATOR USE OF PORTABLE ELECTRONIC

16 DEVICES

17 A person under 18 years of age shall not use any portable electronic device

18 as defined in subdivision 4(82) of this title while operating a moving motor

19 vehicle on a highway. This prohibition shall not apply ~~if it is necessary to~~

20 place an emergency 911 call when use of a portable electronic device is

21 necessary to communicate with, or for communication among, law

22 enforcement or emergency service personnel under emergency circumstances.
