

VERMONT AGENCY OF HUMAN SERVICES - AHS HOUSING INVENTORY - State Fiscal Year 2013

This inventory includes Vermont Agency of Human Services programs with a housing or shelter component. Both state-administered and grant-funded programs are represented. The document is designed as a tool to support the six departments of AHS to think strategically about housing resources available in various regions of the state and to consider interactions between eligibility criteria and service array. Housing Resources (population served) are estimate projections based on the previous fiscal year. Funding levels shown are proxy estimates subject to adjustment over the course of the fiscal year. Unless noted, dollar amounts shown represent the portion (state or federal) which passes through AHS. In some instances, the housing portion of a program is enmeshed with other non-housing services and should not be considered flexible or portable. Actual outcome and funding data is updated in November of the following state fiscal year.
