Effluent tank pumped annually.
Effluent brought to Wastewater
Treatment Plan (onsite wastewater
system would eliminate this need)



Wood savings added to digesters on
a regular basis. Digesters must be
cleaned every 6-7 years. Current
regulations require material to be
brought to a landfill.


The Lamoille County Seat, Hyde Park Village is served by community wastewater and water supply systems, allowing a denser, village-scale development pattern.

Wastewater Key to Village Redevelopment



Lack of wastewater capacity limits potential options for reuse of former Bucks Furniture buildings on “Main Street” (Route 15) through Wolcott Village.

Ecological toilets and greywater systems can be part of the solution



Map of properties with barriers to onsite wastewater systems in the Westford Town Center. Barriers are similar to those encountered at Barnes Camp – small lot sizes, shallow soils, high water table and proximity to surface waters.
