RE: xmLegislator Removal of Word Project Status Report

DATE: March 21, 2016

During the last several weeks our focus has been working on the Amend/Enroll module of xmLegislator. Of the following items (1-5) required of the Amend/Enroll module, our effort has been spent on item #4, the placement of the red Z in order to strike an entire page.

1. Strike Word
2. Strike Line
3. Strike Paragraph
4. Strike Page — places a red Z through the entire page.
5. Strike All — places a red Z on the first page just below the title of the bill and then a red Z all the remaining pages of the document.

We have attempted several times to implement a method which would support the placement of the red Z on a page of the document. Unfortunately, our efforts were unsuccessful. On Monday, March 14<sup>th</sup> we decided to advance the DevExpress Rich Text Edit control to the current version 15.2. This latest version provided further opportunities in how we might implement a process to accomplish this task. Late last week, with version 15.2 in place, we managed to control the placement of the red Z to the extent that we would like to schedule an on-line demonstration of our efforts to the Senate, House and Legislative Council.

Since moving to the 15.2 version of the DevExpress Rich Text Edit with Amend/Enroll we have updated the Agenda, Messaging, Calendar and Amending modules of xmLegislator. We started doing general testing of these modules last week and plan to continue further testing this week. Our goal is to release the Agenda, Messaging, Calendar and Amending modules of xmLegislator next Monday to the Senate and House for further testing as time permits.

We have also added the web and print macro to the tool bar in Journal, Calendar and Amend/Enroll modules.
