My name is Johnny Gifford, Executive Director of Brattleboro Community Television serving eight towns in Windham county.

In the last month alone, I've seen four new members at my station who are all excited to pursue different projects using our resources like a talk show about healing from trauma, films of local live music shows, local youth sports coverage, and an artist creating music videos. We also serve the youth of our community through camps, internships and workshops, which help build artistic, technical, team building and career building skills.

Community media has quite honestly changed my life and a personal goal of mine is to share this impact with others.
