14	REQUIRED
15	(a) Insurers shall provide coverage for colorectal cancer screening in
16	accordance with the most recent published guidelines of the American Cancer
17	Society based on the ages, family histories, and frequencies provided in the
18	guidelines. Such coverage shall include:
19	(1) For an insured 50 years of age or older:
20	(A) One fecal occult blood test per year plus one flexible

1	sigmoidoscopy every five years; or
2	(B) One colonoscopy every 10 years.
3	(2) For an insured who is at high risk for colorectal cancer, colorectal
4	cancer screening examinations and laboratory tests as recommended by the
5	treating physician.
6	(b) For the purposes of subdivision (a)(2) of this section, an individual is at
7	high risk for colorectal cancer if the individual has:
8	(1) A family medical history of colorectal cancer;
9	(2) A prior occurrence of cancer or precursor neoplastic polyps;
10	(3) A prior occurrence of a chronic digestive disease condition such as
11	inflammatory bowel disease, Crohn's disease, or ulcerative colitis; or
12	(4) Other predisposing factors.
13	(c) Benefits provided shall cover the full cost of the colorectal cancer
14	screening, subject to a co-payment no greater than the co-payment applicable
15	to care or services provided by a primary care physician under the insured's
16	policy, provided that no co-payment shall exceed \$25.00. Colorectal cancer
17	screening services shall not be subject to deductible or coinsurance
18	requirements.
19	Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on October 1, 2009 and shall apply to all health
21	benefit plans on and after October 1, 2009 on such date as a health insurer

- offers, issues, or renews the health benefit plan, but in no event later than
- 2 October 1, 2010.
