2	§ 4834. WILD TURKEY DOING DAMAGE; SITE MANAGEMENT PLAN
3	(a) A person may apply to the commissioner for approval of a site-specific
4	management plan for the control of a wild turkey flock doing damage to:
5	(1) a crop, except grass;
6	(2) a crop-bearing plant; or
7	(3) agricultural feed or silage stored on a farm enrolled in the use value
8	appraisal program under 32 V.S.A. chapter 134.
9	(b) The commissioner, after consultation with the Wildlife Service of the
10	U.S. Department of Agriculture, shall approve a site-specific management plan
11	for a wild turkey flock if:
12	(1) the land owned by the person is not posted against hunting;
13	(2) the person can prove that crops, crop bearing plants, or trees are
14	sustaining additional and ongoing damage; and
15	(3) the person has taken reasonable measures to prevent the deer from
16	continuing to damage the crop.
17	(c) A site-specific management plan approved by the commissioner may
18	require measures other than the taking of wild turkey.
