13	Subject: Games of chance; nonprofit organizations; casino nights
14	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to make it possible for certain
15	nonprofit volunteer organizations, such as volunteer fire or rescue
16	organizations, to conduct their allotted three casino nights a year by assuring
17	that a location will be available to them, particularly for those nonprofit
18	organizations located in small villages or towns with few if any available
19	locations nearby in which to hold a casino event.

1 2	An act relating to volunteer nonprofit service organizations and casino nights
3	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
4	Sec. 1. 13 V.S.A. § 2143(d) is amended to read:
5	(d) Casino events shall be limited as follows:
6	(1) A location may be the site of no more than:
7	(A) one casino event in any calendar quarter; ; or
8	(B) three casino events in any calendar year, as long as there are at
9	least 15 days between each event, except that an event organized and executed
10	by a nonprofit organization that is a volunteer organization that provides a
11	municipal service shall not be counted as a casino event under this subdivision
12	<u>(d)(1)</u> .
13	(2) A nonprofit organization, as defined in 32 V.S.A. § 10201(5), may
14	organize and execute no more than:
15	(A) one casino event in any calendar quarter; or
16	(B) three casino events in any calendar year, as long as there are at
17	least 15 days between each event.
