9	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to require that all state law
10	enforcement officers, including those employed by the liquor control board,
11	the department of fish and wildlife, and the department of motor vehicles,
12	serve at the direction and control of the commissioner of public safety.

furnishing, or transporting spirituous liquor, or malt and vinous beverages, and
shall seize the liquors, alcohol, vessels, and implements of sale and the stills or
other apparatus for the manufacture of alcohol in the possession of the person.
He or she may also seize and take into custody any property described in this
section.

(a) The commissioner of public safety, in consultation with the
commissioner of fish and wildlife, with the approval of the governor, may
employ a chief game warden and as many state game wardens as may be
required for the proper enforcement of the fish and wildlife laws of the state.
These officers shall be included in the classified service created in chapter 13
of Title 3. These officers and deputy game wardens employed as herein
provided shall be sworn to the faithful performance of their duties. The
commissioner of public safety, in consultation with the commissioner of fish

and wildlife, may appoint and employ for a limited time as many deputy game

11	that the outside employment will not render the warden unavailable during an
12	emergency, will not physically or mentally exhaust the warden to the point that
13	performance of duties might be affected and will not require that any special
14	consideration be given to scheduling of regular duty hours.

  - (b) The commissioner of public safety, in consultation with the commissioner of fish and wildlife, may enter into a reciprocal assistance agreement with his or her counterpart in any other state. An agreement made under this section shall be for the purpose of cooperating and assisting each other in detecting and apprehending people violating the fish and wildlife or environmental laws of the state, subject to the limitations of section 4192 of this title.
