18	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to remove the requirements for
19	legislative approval of: (1) continued operation of a nuclear energy generation
20	plant beyond the date in the plant's current certificate of public good; and (2)
21	storage of spent fuel at the plant beyond that date.

- It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
- 4 Sec. 1. 30 V.S.A. § 248(e)(2) is amended to read:
 - beyond the date permitted in any certificate of public good granted pursuant to this title, including any certificate in force as of January 1, 2006, unless the general assembly approves and determines that the operation will promote the general welfare, and until the public service board issues a certificate of public good under this section. If the general assembly has not acted under this subsection by July 1, 2008, the board may commence proceedings under this section and under 10 V.S.A. chapter 157, relating to the storage of radioactive material, but may not issue a final order or certificate of public good until the general assembly determines that operation will promote the general welfare and grants approval for that operation.
 - Sec. 2. 10 V.S.A. § 6522(c)(4) is amended to read:
 - (4) Compliance with the provisions of this subchapter shall constitute compliance with the provisions of this chapter that require that approval be obtained from the general assembly before construction or establishment of a facility for the deposit or storage of spent nuclear fuel, but only to the extent specified in this subchapter or authorized under this subchapter. The public service board is authorized to hear and issue a certificate of public good for

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1	such a facility under 30 V.S.A. § 248, to the extent specified or authorized in
2	this subchapter. Other agencies of the state also may receive and act on
3	applications related to the construction or establishment of such a facility,
4	provided that any approval for such a facility applies only to the extent

3	(1) is required to obtain the approval of the general assembly before

6	(2) is required to obtain a section 248 certificate of public good from the
7	public service board before operation beyond that date.
8	(d) It is appropriate that the spent fuel storage issue be framed and
9	addressed as a part of the larger societal discussion of broader economic and
10	environmental issues relating to the operation of a nuclear facility in the state,
11	including an assessment of the potential need for the operation of the facility
12	and its economic benefits, risks, and costs; and in order to allow opportunity to
13	assess alternatives that may be more cost-effective or that otherwise may better
14	promote the general welfare.
15	(e) It is appropriate for the general assembly to require that when the public
16	service board addresses the issue of whether to issue a certificate of public
17	good for the operation of the plant beyond the date specified in a previous
18	certificate of public good, it evaluate the issue under present day cost benefit
19	assumptions and analyses forming the basis of the certificate of public good for

(f) For the foregoing reasons, the general assembly shall consider
concurrently the issue of storage of spent nuclear fuel derived from the
operation of Vermont Yankee nuclear power station after March 21, 2012 as
set forth in No. 74 of the Acts of the 2005 session and the operation of
Vermont Yankee after March 21, 2012 as set forth in 30 V.S.A. § 248, and
shall grant the approval or deny the approval of such activities concurrently.
Accordingly, if the general assembly approves and determines that the
operation of the facility beyond the date permitted in any certificate of public
good granted pursuant to this title will promote the public welfare, then the
approval of the general assembly for the storage of spent fuel derived from the
operation of the Vermont Yankee nuclear power station after March 21, 2012
will also be deemed approval as required in 10 V.S.A. § 6522.
