Committee Relieved of Consideration and Bill Committee to Other Committee

S. 95

Rep. Turner of Milton moved that the committee on Rules be relieved of House bill, entitled

An act relating to exemptions for newspaper deliverers from the unemployment statutes; relieving an employer's experience rating record of charges; studying the receipt of unemployment compensation between academic terms; allowing school employees to be paid wages over the course of a year; and requiring employers to furnish required work apparel

And that the bill be committed to the committee on General, Housing and Military Affairs, which was agreed to.

Committee Relieved of Consideration and Bill Committee to Other Committee

S. 98

Rep. Turner of Milton moved that the committee on Rules be relieved of House bill, entitled

An act relating to authorizing owner-financed property sales

And that the bill be committed to the committee on Commerce and Economic Development, which was agreed to.

Senate Proposal of Amendment to House Proposal of Amendment Concurred in with a Further Amendment Thereto

S. 92

Senate bill, entitled

An act relating to the protection of students' health by requiring the use of safe cleaning products in schools

Was taken up and **Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge** moved to concur in the Senate proposal of amendment to House proposal of amendment with a further amendment thereto as follows:

<u>First</u>: In Sec. 2 (Transition), subdivision (1), by striking both references to "2011" and inserting in lieu thereof "2012"

<u>Second</u>: In Sec. 2, subdivision (2), by striking both references to "2012" and inserting in lieu thereof "2013"

<u>Third</u>: In Sec. 4 (Effective Date), by striking "<u>2011</u>" and inserting in lieu thereof "<u>2012</u>"

Which proposal of amendment was considered and concurred in.
