17	parent, sibling, or grandchild if the individual is deceased and the individual
18	meets the following eligibility criteria:
19	(1) Completed completed a minimum two-year tour of federal active
20	military duty, unless discharged for the convenience of the government or

1	retired from a reserve military component, and received an honorable
2	discharge, a discharge under honorable conditions, died before separating from
3	the federal active-duty military, or was declared missing in action by the
