- 6 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to amend
- 7 multiple provisions related to the hunting of game. The bill would set a
- 8 minimum limit for the auction of a moose permit. The bill authorizes the
- 9 Commissioner of Fish and Wildlife to issue up to two additional no-cost moose
- licenses each calendar year to an adult 22 years of age or older who has a
- life-threatening illness. The bill would prohibit the importation or possession
- of wild boar and its offspring or variants. The bill would also authorize the
- Department of Fish and Wildlife to hold raffles or dispose of property by
- games of chance, provided that the proceeds of games of chance shall be used
- solely to fund actions consistent with the purposes of the Department. The bill
- amends the requirements for a falconry license, and repeals the prohibition on
- the snaring of animals. In addition, the bill would amend the authority of the
- 18 Fish and Wildlife Board to adopt rules, including granting the Board the
- authority to designate the number of deer or moose that can be harvested in
- 20 each wildlife management unit and whether hunters would be required to wear
- 21 blaze orange clothing while hunting.

2	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
3	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 4254(i)(1) is amended to read:
4	(i)(1) If the board Board establishes a moose hunting season, up to five
5	moose permits shall be set aside to be auctioned. The moose permits set aside
6	for auction shall be in addition to the number of annual moose permits
7	authorized by the Board. The board Board shall adopt rules necessary for the
8	department Department to establish, implement, and run the auction process.
9	The Commissioner annually may establish a minimum dollar amount of not
