| 7 | Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to provide that |
| 8 | the public trust doctrine that applies to the navigable rivers, streams, brooks, |

| 10 | proposes to require the Department of Environmental Conservation to act to |
| 11 | protect the public's interests in these waters by providing information to |

| and creeks of the State. A town shall include the notice in each tax bill and |
| notice of delinquent taxes which it mails during 2014 and every fifth year |
| thereafter to a taxpayer of that town. The notice to property owners shall |
| explain that the public trust doctrine extends to the 10-year high-water mark in |
| the navigable rivers, streams, brooks, and creeks of the State, and that the |
| public has a right to pass through these lands without harassment from a |
| riparian landowner. |
| Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE |
| This act shall take effect on July 1, 2013. |
