7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to amend the
8	definition of fourth class license to include malt beverages.
9	An act relating to fourth class licenses
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 7 V.S.A. § 2 is amended to read:
12	§ 2. DEFINITIONS
13	The following words as used in this title, unless a contrary meaning is
14	required by the context, shall have the following meaning:
15	* * *
16	(28) "Fourth class license" or "farmers' market license": the license
17	granted by the liquor control board Liquor Control Board permitting a
18	manufacturer or rectifier of malt or vinous beverages or spirits to sell by the
19	unopened container and distribute, by the glass with or without charge,

beverages manufactured by the licensee. No more than a combined total of ten

fourth class and farmers' market licenses may be granted to a licensed	
manufacturer or rectifier. At only one fourth class license location, a	
manufacturer or rectifier of malt or vinous beverages may sell by the unopened	
container and distribute by the glass, with or without charge, <u>malt or</u> vinous	
beverages produced by no more than five additional manufacturers or	
rectifiers, provided these beverages are purchased on invoice from the	
manufacturer or rectifier. A manufacturer or rectifier of <u>malt or</u> vinous	
beverages may sell its product to no more than five additional manufacturers or	
rectifiers. A fourth class licensee may distribute by the glass no more than two	
ounces of malt or vinous beverage with a total of eight ounces to each retail	
customer and no more than one-quarter ounce of spirits with a total of one	
ounce to each retail customer for consumption on the manufacturer's premises	
or at a farmers' market. A farmers' market license is valid for all dates of	
operation for a specific farmers' market location.
