3	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
4	all candidates for Adjutant and Inspector General shall have served in the
5	Armed Forces of the United States and have attained the rank of Lieutenant
6	Colonel or above.
7 8	An act relating to the qualifications for candidates for Adjutant and Inspector General
9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

11	§ 12. LEGISLATIVE ELECTIONS; UNIFORM BALLOTS
12	(a) Whenever there is a known contested election for speaker of the house
13	of representatives Speaker of the House of Representatives, president pro
14	tempore of the senate President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and in elections by
15	the joint assembly of the legislature General Assembly, the secretary of state
16	Secretary of State shall prepare a ballot for each office, listing the names of the
17	known candidates for the office in the alphabetical order of their surnames, and
18	leaving thereon sufficient blank spaces to take care of any nominations from
19	the floor.

(b) A candidate for office shall, not later than one week preceding the		
election, notify the secretary of state Secretary of State in writing of his or her		
candidacy, naming the particular office. If he or she fails so to notify the

ballot. No ballot may be used other than the official ballot provided by the		
secretary of state Secretary of State.		
(c) A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General shall have served in the

§ 363. OFFICERS GENERALLY		
The general assembly General Assembly shall biennially elect an adjutant		
and inspector general Adjutant and Inspector General, who shall also be		
quartermaster general Quartermaster General with the rank of a major general		
Major General. A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General shall have		
served in the Armed Forces of the United States and attained the rank of		
<u>Lieutenant Colonel or above</u> . Such officer The Adjutant and Inspector General		
may appoint a deputy with appropriate rank, an assistant adjutant general for		
army Assistant Adjutant General for Army, an assistant adjutant general for air		
Assistant Adjutant General for Air, an assistant adjutant general for joint		
operations Assistant Adjutant General for Joint Operations, a sergeant major
