10	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to establish a livable wage for		
11	Vermont employees.		
12	An act relating to establishing a livable wage		
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:		
14	Sec. 1. 21 V.S.A. § 384 is amended to read:		
15	§ 384. EMPLOYMENT; WAGES LIVABLE WAGE		
16	(a) An employer shall not employ an employee at a rate of less than \$7.25,		
17	and, beginning January 1, 2007, and on each subsequent January 1, the		
18	minimum wage rate shall be increased by five percent or the percentage		
19	increase of the Consumer Price Index, CPI U, U.S. city average, not seasonally		
20	adjusted, or successor index, as calculated by the U.S. Department of Labor or		

1	successor agency for the 12 months preceding the previous September 1,
2	whichever is smaller, but in no event shall the minimum wage be decreased.
3	An employer shall not employ an employee at a rate of less than \$ 12.48, and
4	beginning January 1, 2014, and on each subsequent January 1, the livable wage
5	shall be increased by five percent or the percentage increase of the Consumer
6	Price Index, CPI-U, U.S. city average, not seasonally adjusted, or successor
7	index, as calculated by the U.S. Department of Labor or successor agency for
8	the 12 months preceding the previous September 1, whichever is smaller, but
9	in no event shall the livable wage be decreased. The minimum livable wage
10	shall be rounded off to the nearest \$0.01. An employer in the hotel, motel,
11	tourist place, and restaurant industry shall not employ a service or tipped
12	employee at a basic wage rate less than \$3.65 an hour, and beginning January
13	1, 2008, and on each January 1 thereafter, this basic tip wage rate shall be
14	increased at the same percentage rate as the minimum wage rate. For the
15	purposes of this subsection, "a service or tipped employee" means an
16	employee of a hotel, motel, tourist place, or restaurant who customarily and
17	regularly receives more than \$120.00 per month in tips for direct and personal
18	customer service. If the minimum wage rate established by the United States
19	<u>U.S.</u> government is greater than the <u>livable wage</u> rate established for Vermont
20	for any year, the minimum livable wage rate for that year shall be the rate
21	established by the United States U.S. government.
