17	percentage increase of the Consumer Price Index, CPI-U, U.S. city average,
18	not seasonally adjusted, or successor index, as calculated by the U.S.
19	Department of Labor or successor agency for the 12 months preceding the
20	previous September 1, whichever is smaller, but in no event shall the minimum

1	wage be decreased. The minimum wage shall be rounded off to the nearest
2	\$0.01. An employer in the hotel, motel, tourist place, and restaurant industry
3	shall not employ a service or tipped employee at a basic wage rate less than
4	\$3.65 §6.65 an hour, and beginning January 1, 2008, and on each January 1
5	thereafter, this basic tip wage rate shall be increased at the same percentage
6	rate as the minimum wage rate. For the purposes of this subsection, "a service
7	or tipped employee" means an employee of a hotel, motel, tourist place, or
8	restaurant who customarily and regularly receives more than \$120.00 per
9	month in tips for direct and personal customer service. If the minimum wage
10	rate established by the United States U.S. government is greater than the rate
11	established for Vermont for any year, the minimum wage rate for that year
