- 1. Physical Security Devices and Visitor Management
- 2. Emergency Response Training
- 3. Interagency Communications
- 4. Jurisdictional Authority
- 5. Training



Management

- 1. Visitor Management practices inconsistent
- 2. Lack of access control (physical and policy)
- Panic and Duress Alarms
- 4. Use of safety cameras



Training

- 1. Evacuations, Sheltering, Building Lockdowns
- 2. Fire Alarms
- 3. Panic/Duress Alarms
- 4. Utilization of Staff

Communication

- 1. State complex security working group
- 2. Intelligence and information sharing working group
- 3. Agency to Agency communication and partnership

Authority

1. Blurred lines of authority and responsibility for state complex security



Capitol Police - Training

- 1. Capital Police
- State complex employee emergency preparedness training
- 3. Training and exercise opportunities for local, county and state first responders
