


How does Vermont compare?





How has Vermont fared over time?



Vermont Grants' eroding "buying power"



The average fulltime Vermont Grant covered 22 percent of the cost of tuition, fees, room and board at Vermont Public, 4-year institutions in 1980.

Using 1980 constant dollars, today it covers only 8 percent.

Loss in federal funding impacts critical services

VSAC served as the designated agency to administer the State's College Access Challenge Grant (CACG) since 2008.

In FY14, the State failed to meet the Maintenance of Effort Requirement for CACG under Section 137 of the Higher Education Act (HEA). This resulted in a loss of \$3 million dollars for career and education planning services to the state.


The critical work ahead...

Aspiration Rate

Definition: The proportion of Vermont's HS graduates who plan to enroll in a postsecondary education or training program within 6 months of graduation

Aspiration rates differ significantly between:

- HS Graduates whose parents don't have a 4-yr degree
- HS Graduates whose parents have a 4-yr degree
