Frequently Asked Questions

How do I find the Prevailing Wage Rate for an occupation ?

1. Find the Prevailing Wage Area where the job is located from the map or list of towns by area on pages 6-7.
2. Go to the Prevailing Wage table on pages 4-5.
3. Find the appropriate occupation.
4. Use the Wage Rate from the column for the correct Prevailing Wage Area.

What are the Prevailing Wage Areas ?

The state is divided into three geographic areas for determining Prevailing Wage Rates.

Burlington-South Burlington Metropolitan New England City and Town Area (NECTA)

Southern Vermont Area

Northern Vermont Area

Which projects are covered ?

Any project authorized or funded by the State of Vermont "Capital Construction Act" and which cost more than \$100,000. To find out if a specific project is covered, contact the Department of Buildings and General Services, Deborah Damore, at (802) 828-2211 or deborah.damore@state.vt.us.

Which occupations are covered ?

Prevailing Wage requirements are only applicable to construction related occupations listed on pages 4 and 5. If a particular occupation is not listed, contact the Vermont Department of Labor at (802) 828-4153 to discuss whether a Prevailing Wage rate would apply to that occupation. Definitions for all occupations can be found on the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics website: www.bls.gov/oes/current/oes_stru.htm.

What is the Prevailing Wage requirement ?

All employees working on construction projects funded by the State of Vermont's Capital Construction Act shall be paid no less than the mean (average) prevailing wage determined by the Vermont Department of Labor. The mean prevailing wage rates published here are effective as of June 11, 2013. These rates will remain in effect until the next publication, anticipated for June 2014.

Is there a Fringe Benefit requirement ?

Under current Vermont law, there is no requirement for the Prevailing Wage rate to include Fringe Benefits. Prevailing wage rates are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay, and do not include the cost of fringe benefits.

What is the source of the wage rates ?

Prevailing wage rates are based on the latest Occupational Employment and Wage Survey information released in April 2013. Additional information is available at www.vtLmi.info or call the Vermont Department of Labor, Economic & Labor Market Information Division at (802) 828- 4153.

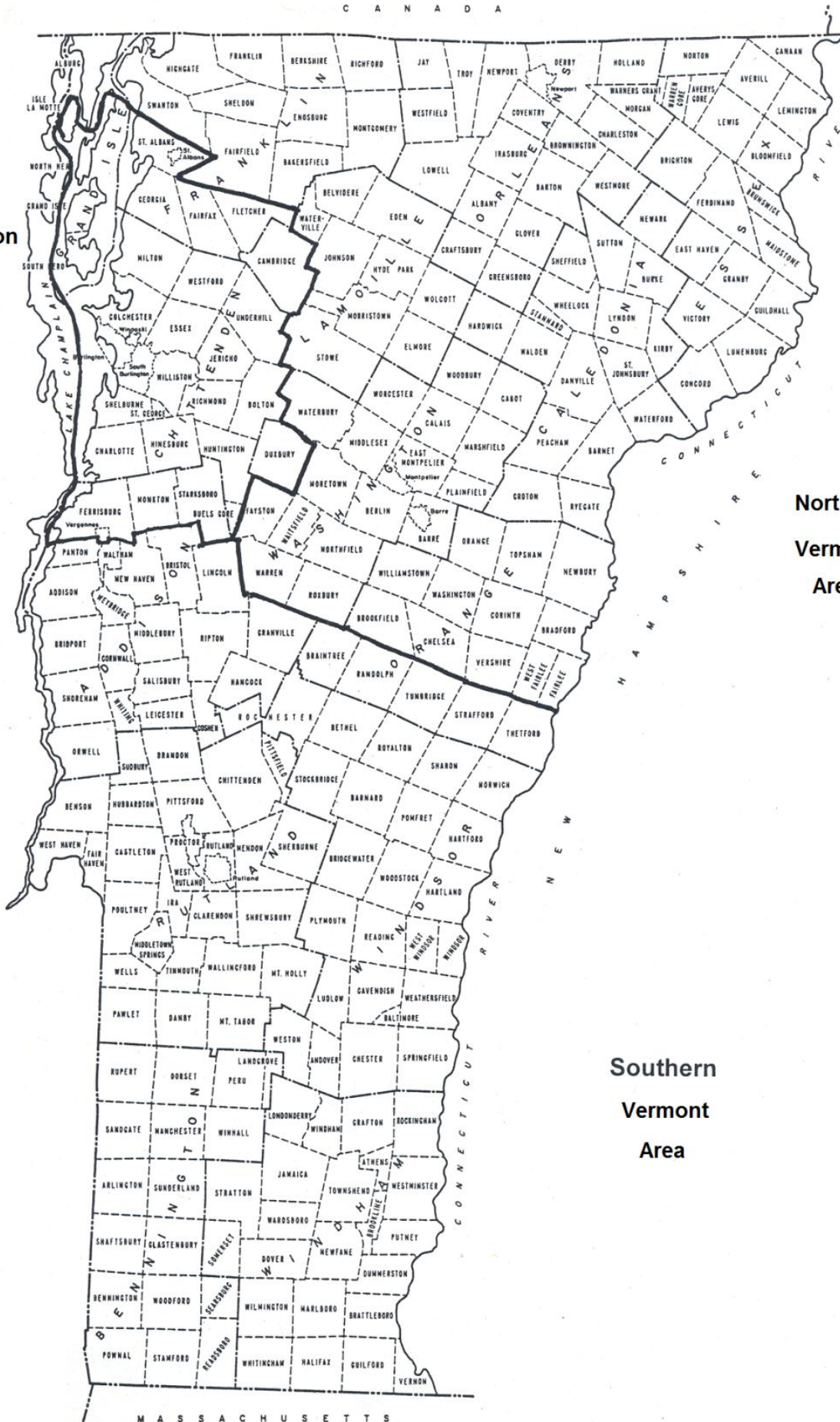
