(c) A manufacturer or rectifier of vinous beverages that is licensed in-state or out-of-state and holds valid state State and federal permits and operates a winery in the United States, may apply for a retail shipping license by filing with the Department of Liquor Control an application in a form required by the Department accompanied by a copy of its in-state or out-of-state license and the fee as required by subdivision 231(a)(7)(C) of this title. The retail shipping license may be renewed annually by filing the renewal fee as required by subdivision 231(a)(7)(C) of this title accompanied by the licensee's current instate or out-of-state manufacturer's license. This license permits the holder, which includes the holder's affiliates, franchises, and subsidiaries, to sell up to

5,000 gallons of vinous beverages a year directly to first first- or second class

1	second-class licensees and deliver the beverages by common carrier or, the
2	manufacturer's or rectifier's own vehicles vehicle, or the vehicle of an
3	employee of a manufacturer or rectifier, or the vehicle of the first- or second-
4	class-license holder, provided that the beverages are sold on invoice, and no
