4	§ 4454. CONSTRUCTION
5	(a) This chapter shall not be construed to limit or restrict in any way the
6	right of a practitioner of another occupation which is regulated by this state
7	State from performing services within the scope of his or her professional
8	practice.
9	(b) This chapter shall not be construed to limit the authority of the board to
10	determine and evaluate the qualifications of, issue licenses to, or discipline
11	licensees who are within the jurisdiction of the board.
12	§ 4455. ADVISOR APPOINTEES
13	(a) The secretary, in consultation with the commissioner of education,

11	§ 4457. LICENSURE; APPLICATIONS; ELIGIBILITY
12	Applicants for licenses under this chapter shall submit an application to the
13	department Office on a form furnished by the department Office, along with
14	payment of the specified fee and evidence of the eligibility qualifications
15	established by the board Director which shall include, at a minimum:
16	* * *
17	(4) Passing an examination in audiology or speech-language pathology
18	approved by the department Director, which, in the case of the audiology
19	examination, shall include a section which is equivalent to the hearing aid
20	dispensers examination described in section 3295 of this title. Audiologists

who have passed an examination chosen by the department Director are not

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1	required to take the hearing aid dispensers examination required by section
2	3295.
3	§ 4458. RENEWALS; CONTINUING EDUCATION
4	(a) A license shall be renewed at an interval determined by the board which
5	shall be no fewer than every two years and no more than every seven years on
6	a schedule set by the Office upon payment of the renewal fee, provided the
7	person applying for renewal completes professional development activities in
8	accord with the processes approved by the department or the board Director,
9	during the interval. The board Director shall establish, by rule, guidelines and
10	criteria for the renewal or reinstatement of licenses issued under this chapter.
11	(b) At the time interval required for renewal, the department shall forward a
12	renewal form to each licensee. Upon receipt of the completed application and
13	the renewal fee, the department shall issue a new license.

2	Sec. 52. TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS; SPEECH LANGUAGE
3	PATHOLOGISTS AND AUDIOLOGISTS; SPEECH LANGUAGE
4	PATHOLOGIST ASSISTANTS
5	(a)(1) As of the September 1, 2014, all Speech Language Pathologists and
6	Audiologists currently licensed and in good standing with the Agency of
7	Education shall be deemed licensed by the Secretary of State's Office of
8	Professional Regulation. The Office of Professional Regulation shall re-issue
9	licenses at no charge after that date and shall establish a single expiration and
10	renewal date for all of these licensees.
11	(2) Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists employed in
12	schools and holding an endorsement from the Agency of Education shall retain
13	that endorsement and shall renew it with the Agency as required by law, in
14	addition to licensure with the Office of Professional Regulation.
15	(b) On or before December 1, 2014, the Office of Professional Regulation
16	shall propose to the House and Senate Committees on Government Operations
17	language to license and regulate the profession of Speech Language Pathology
18	Assistant as recommended by its Sunrise Review of 2013, and shall include in
19	its proposal any further recommendations for the clear and efficient regulation
20	of Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists.

1	Sec. 53. EFFECTIVE DATES
2	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2014 except:
