## Summary of Sections of S.252 - An act relating to financing for Green Mountain Care

- **Sec. 1.** Legislative intent
- Sec. 2. Principles for health care financing
- **Secs. 3-5.** Exchange must allow employers to buy Exchange plans through the website, through navigators, by phone, or directly from carriers
- **Secs. 6-7a.** Federal employees, including military, will be deemed to be covered by Green Mountain Care by participating in FEHBP/TRICARE; TRICARE may need supplemental plans
- Sec. 8. Benefit package for Green Mountain Care is the same as Exchange benefit package
- **Sec. 9.** Timeline for Administration to identify the elements of Green Mountain Care to be contracted out, to solicit bids, and to award contracts
- **Sec. 10.** Requires Administration to submit a conceptual waiver application for the Waiver for State Innovation
- **Secs. 11-12.** Requires employers to pay the employer assessment if they offer health insurance to an employee but the employee enrolls in Medicaid
- Sec. 13. Clarifies amount of employer assessment for 2014, moves it to a calendar year
- **Sec. 14.** Requires report about the Blueprint
- **Sec. 15.** Requires report about the health insurer surpluses
- **Sec. 16.** Requires recommendation about getting everyone Exchange-level coverage before Green Mountain Care
- Sec. 17. Requires report about transitioning public employees to Green Mountain Care
- **Sec. 18.** Requires Administration to consult with JFO on its work on the cost of Green Mountain Care, distribution of health care spending, and impact of existing health care reform initiatives
- Sec. 19. Requires report on whether the State should be its own pharmacy benefit manager
- Sec. 20. Requires report on whether Vermont should encourage independent physician practices
- Sec. 21. Requires report on health information technology and intellectual property protection
- Sec. 22. Requires Administration and others to put on a health care workforce symposium
- Sec. 23. Effective date
