4	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow a
5	patient's family member or person with a known close relationship to a patient
6	to consent to admission to hospice care on behalf of a patient with no available
7	agent or guardian. It would also repeal a provision directing the Department of
8	Health to adopt rules regarding persons other than a patient, agent, or guardian
9	giving informed consent for a DNR/COLST order.

An act relating to consent for admission to hospice care

Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 9710 is added to read:

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

13 § 9710. CONSENT FOR HOSPICE CARE 14 (a) A family member of a patient or a person with a known close 15 relationship to the patient may provide informed consent for the patient's admission to hospice care if the patient does not have an agent or guardian or 16 17 the patient's agent or guardian, or both, if applicable, is unavailable. Decisions made by the family member or person with a known close relationship shall 18 19 protect the patient's own wishes in the same manner as decisions made by an 20 agent as described in subsection 9711(d) of this title.

1	(b) As used in this section, "hospice care" means a program of care and
2	support provided by a Medicare-certified hospice provider to help an
3	individual with a terminal condition to live comfortably by providing palliative
4	care, including effective pain and symptom management. Hospice care may
5	include services provided by an interdisciplinary team that are intended to
6	address the physical, emotional, psychosocial, and spiritual needs of the
7	individual and his or her family.

9	18 V.S.A. § 9708(f) (rulemaking for DNR/COLST) is repealed.
10	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
11	This act shall take effect on passage.
