- MSA settled claims by states against the tobacco industry in 1998
- Vermont sued under public health & consumer protection laws
- Established program to counter youth tobacco use
- Limits tobacco marketing strategies











Master Tobacco Settlement Agreement

- Annual payment to states in perpetuity for advancement of public health
- 10 years of extra payments 2008-2017, the Strategic Contribution Fund
- Vermont was awarded a large share of the extra payments in recognition of its leadership in tobacco control efforts, about \$12m/year
- Total payments average about \$35m in last 6 years











Vermont's Tobacco Funds

VT Legislature created 2 special funds in 1999



O The Tobacco Litigation Settlement Fund

to support tobacco use prevention, cessation & control & other health care purposes



• The Tobacco Trust Fund a self-sustaining, perpetual fund for tobacco cessation & prevention which is not dependent upon tobacco sales volume

VT Tobacco Control Program



- Four long term goals:
 - ❖ Reduce adult cigarette smoking prevalence to 12% by 2020. Currently 17%, down from 22% in 2001. 48% of current smokers attempted to quit in 2012



- Reduce exposure of non-smokers to secondhand smoke
- Maintain low prevalence of other tobacco produce use. Is low among adults, 1-11%









Vermont Tobacco Evaluation and Review Board



 Oversees evaluation of the Tobacco Control Program



- Reviews & approves media campaigns
- Reviews community coalition applications and recommends grants to fund


