
Map: towns in GMP service territory and location of our facilities

Infrastructure

- 185 substations
- 329,580 poles
- 976 miles of transmission lines
- 11,273 miles of distribution lines
- \$115 million in total capital investments in FY13 to improve reliability for customers
- Green Mountain Power rigorously inspects and maintains this infrastructure for optimal performance and reliability

- The EIC is working with partners to build 10 MW of new solar generation by the end of 2015, which will make Rutland the Solar Capital of New England.




Energy Portfolio

GMP-Owned Renewable Generation

- 100+ MW of hydro capacity, at 32 hydro facilities
- 500+ kW of solar generation capacity, with more in development
- 69 MW wind power capacity
 - o 63 MW Kingdom Community Wind (8 MW sold to Vermont Electric Coop)
 - 6 MW Searsburg
 - o 2 Northern Power Systems 100 kW wind turbines (Vergennes and Bridport)

Customer-Owned Generation

• 13.4 MW net metered customers (includes 2.2 MW Air National Guard solar, which is exempt from the 4% cap).

Rates

Our strategy of holding long-term fixed energy contracts while retaining some open portfolio position has kept GMP's rates stable and among the lowest in New England over the past 20 years. Our plan is to maintain that preferred position.

Community and Charitable Contributions

Green Mountain Power's owner donates \$310,000 each year to community organizations throughout Vermont, including significant donations to the United Way and WARMTH.
