6	First: By striking out Sec. 2 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the
7	following:
8	Sec. 2. 32 V.S.A. § 9741 is amended to read:
9	§ 9741. SALES NOT COVERED
10	Retail sales and use of the following shall be exempt from the tax on retail
11	sales imposed under section 9771 of this title and the use tax imposed under
12	section 9773 of this title.
13	* * *
14	(49) Clean high carbon bulking agents, as that term is used in the
15	Agency of Natural Resources' Solid Waste Management Rules, used for
16	commercial or on-farm composting, and food residuals used for commercial or
17	on-farm composting or on-farm energy production;
18	(50) Compost, animal manure, manipulated animal manure, and planting
19	mix when any of these items are sold in bulk. As used in this subsection, the
20	term "sold in bulk" shall mean sold in a form that is not prepackaged, or sold
21	in a packaged form in volumes greater than one cubic yard.

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1	Second: By striking out Sec. 3 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof
2	the following:
3	Sec. 3. STATUTORY PURPOSE
4	The statutory purpose of the exemptions for composting materials, compost,
5	animal manure, manipulated animal manure, and planting mix in 32 V.S.A.
6	§ 9741(49) and (50) is to support the composting industry, and to further the
7	goals of 2012 Acts and Resolves No. 148. The Office of Legislative Council is
8	authorized to place these statutory purposes in the appropriate statutory
9	sections prior to July 1, 2014.
