1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
2	The Committee on Appropriations to which was referred House Bill
3	No. 883 entitled "An act relating to expanded prekindergarten-grade 12 school
4	districts" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends
5	that the bill as proposed to be amended by the Committee on Ways and Means
6	as amended be further amended as follows:
7	First: In Sec. 1, 16 V.S.A. § 4056 (statewide realignment plan; elements),
8	in subsection (b), by striking out subdivision (2) in its entirety and inserting in
9	lieu thereof a new subdivision (2) to read:
10	(2) have an average daily membership of at least 1,000 students or result
11	from the realignment of at least four existing districts, or both, as may be
12	adjusted by the flexibility authority in subsection 4057(c) of this title;
13	Second: After Sec. 7, by inserting five new sections to be Secs. 8 through
14	12 and a related reader assistance heading to read:
15	* * * Special Fund; Appropriations; Positions * * *
16	Sec. 8. PREKINDERGARTEN-GRADE 12 DISTRICT SPECIAL FUND
17	(a) There is created a special fund pursuant to 32 V.S.A. chapter 7,
18	subchapter 5, comprising sums deposited into this account and interest
19	accruing to the Fund. Any remaining balance at the end of the fiscal year shall
20	be carried forward in the Fund.

1	(b) Monies in the Fund shall be available to the Agency of Education to be	
2	used to support the purposes of this act as follows:	
3	(1) to support the work of the Agency to provide technical assistance to	
4	districts during the voluntary realignment process;	
5	(2) to support the work of the State Board of Education during the	
6	voluntary realignment process and to review and prepare recommendations	
7	regarding the Statewide Realignment Plan;	
8	(3) to support the work of the Design Team created in Sec. 1, 16 V.S.A.	
9	§ 4054, of this act to monitor the voluntary realignment process, to conduct	
10	public hearings and other public engagement activities, and to develop the	
11	preliminary and final Plans;	
12	(4) to contract for technical assistance from recognized experts on	
13	behalf of the Design Team, including for the services of a skilled facilitator	
14	with deep experience in public policy at the community and State levels for the	
15	ten or more public hearings preceding development of the preliminary	
16	Plan; and	
17	(5) to reimburse up to \$20,000.00 in fees incurred by groups of districts	
18	during the voluntary realignment process pursuant to 2012 Acts and Resolves	
19	No. 156, Sec. 9.	
20	(c) The fund shall be known as the Prekindergarten-Grade 12 District	
21	Special Fund.	

1	(d) This section and the Fund it creates are repealed on July 1, 2024.
2	Sec. 9. POSITIONS; AGENCY OF EDUCATION
3	The General Assembly authorizes the establishment of four new limited
4	service positions in the Agency of Education in fiscal year 2015 as follows:
5	(1) one clerical position to provide assistance primarily to the Design
6	Team created in Sec. 1 of this act; and
7	(2) three analyst positions to provide technical assistance to school
8	districts during the voluntary realignment process and after adoption of the
9	Statewide Realignment Plan, to the State Board, and to the Design Team.
10	Sec. 10. TRANSFERS
11	(a) The sum of \$2,069,175.00 is transferred in fiscal year 2014 from the
12	Supplemental Property Tax Relief Fund created by 32 V.S.A. § 6075 to the
13	Prekindergarten-Grade 12 District Special Fund for use in fiscal years 2015
14	and 2016.
15	(b) The sum of \$329,000.00 in unexpended monies appropriated to support
16	the purposes of 2010 Acts and Resolves No. 153 and 2012 Acts and Resolves
17	No. 156 is transferred in fiscal year 2014 and may be carried forward to fiscal
18	year 2015 for the purpose of funding the positions and activities authorized
19	under Secs. 8 and 9 of this act.

1	Sec. 11. PREKINDERGARTEN-GRADE 12 DISTRICT
2	APPROPRIATIONS
3	The following sums are appropriated from the Prekindergarten–Grade 12
4	District Special Fund to the Agency of Education in fiscal year 2015:
5	(1) the sum of \$362,650.00 for personal services;
6	(2) the sum of \$53,575.00 for operational expenses; and
7	(3) the sum of \$351,000.00 for grant funding for districts.
8	Sec. 12. EDUCATION ANALYST; UNIFORM CHART OF ACCOUNTS
9	BUSINESS MANAGER HANDBOOK AND TRAINING;
10	SOFTWARE SPECIFICATIONS
11	Secs. 8–11 of this act are intended to be in addition to, and to work in
12	concert with, those sections of 2014 Acts and Resolves No. (H.889)
13	(education tax) regarding an education analyst who shall create tools and
14	indicators for State and local education decision makers and a contract for
15	development and completion of a uniform chart of accounts; an updated,
16	comprehensive accounting manual, with related business rules, for school
17	district business managers; related training programs; and specifications for
18	school financial software.
