Subject: Health; health insurance; out-of-state employers; benefits; same-sex
couples; parity

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require
employers domiciled outside of Vermont to offer the same health coverage and
benefits to employees with a same-sex spouse as to employees with an
opposite-sex spouse.

1 An act relating to group health coverage for same-sex spouses

2 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

3 Sec. 1. 8 V.S.A. § 4063b is added to read:

4 § 4063b. COVERAGE FOR EMPLOYEES OF AN EMPLOYER

5 DOMICILED OUTSIDE OF VERMONT

6 (a) As used in this section:

7 (1) “Health insurance” shall have the same meaning as “group health
8 insurance policy or subscriber contract” in section 4091a of this title.

9 (2) “Party to a civil union” shall have the same meaning as in 15 V.S.A.
10 § 1201.

11 (b) To the extent permitted under federal law, Vermont residents who work
12 for an employer domiciled outside of Vermont and who are parties to a civil
13 union or same-sex marriage shall be provided with the same health insurance
14 coverage and benefits as the employer offers to its employees who are parties
15 to a heterosexual marriage.

16 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

17 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
