9	(a) No later than January 1, 2013 On or before September 1, 2014, every
10	State, local, county, and municipal law enforcement agency that employs one
11	or more certified law enforcement officers, and every law enforcement officer
12	who exercises law enforcement authority pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1936a and
13	who is trained in compliance with section 2358 of this title, shall adopt a
14	bias-free policing policy. The policy shall contain the following essential
15	elements of such a policy as determined by the Law Enforcement Advisory
16	Board after its review of either the current Vermont State Police Police and
17	bias-free policing policy or the most current model policy issued by the Office
18	of the Attorney General.
19	(b) The policy shall encourage ongoing bias free law enforcement training
20	for State, local, county, and municipal law enforcement agencies If a law
21	enforcement agency or officer that is required to adopt a policy pursuant to

1	subsection (a) of this section fails to do so on or before September 1, 2014, that
2	agency or officer shall be deemed to have adopted, and shall follow and
3	enforce, the model policy issued by the Office of the Attorney General.
4	(c) On or before September 7, 2014, and annually thereafter as part of their
5	annual training report to the Council, every State, local, county, and municipal
6	law enforcement agency, and every law enforcement officer who exercises law
7	enforcement authority pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1936a and who is trained in
8	compliance with section 2358 of this title, shall report to the Council whether
9	the agency or officer has adopted a bias-free policing policy in accordance
10	with subsections (a) and (b) of this section and which policy has been adopted.
11	The Criminal Justice Training Council shall determine, as part of the Council's
12	annual certification of training requirements, if current officers have received
13	training on bias-free policing.
14	(d) On or before October 15, 2014, and annually thereafter on April 1, the
15	Criminal Justice Training Council shall report to the House and Senate
16	Committees on Judiciary which departments and officers have adopted a
17	bias-free policing policy, which policy has been adopted, and whether officers
18	have received training on bias-free policing.
19	(e) On or before September 1, 2014, every State, local, county, and
20	municipal law enforcement agencies that employ one or more certified law
21	enforcement officers are encouraged to work with the Vermont Association of

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1	Chiefs of Police to extend the collection of roadside-stop race data uniformly
2	throughout state law enforcement agencies, with the goal of obtaining uniform
3	roadside stop race data for analysis agency shall collect roadside stop data,
4	including the age, gender, race, and ethnicity of drivers. Law enforcement
5	agencies shall work with the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council with
6	the goals of collecting uniform data, adopting uniform storage methods and
7	periods, and ensuring that data can be analyzed. Roadside stop data shall be
8	public.
