2 Representative Kilmartin of Newport City moves to amend the House  
3 proposal of amendment as follows:

4 First: In Sec. 3, 20 V.S.A. § 2366, by striking out subsection (e) in its  
5 entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection (e) to read as follows:

6 (e) As used in this subsection, the phrase “roadside stop data” shall not be  
7 construed to include a driver’s name or any other personally identifying  
8 information. On or before September 1, 2014, every State, local, county, and  
9 municipal law enforcement agencies that employ one or more certified law  
10 enforcement officers are encouraged to work with the Vermont Association of  
11 Chiefs of Police to extend the collection of roadside stop race data uniformly  
12 throughout state law enforcement agencies, with the goal of obtaining uniform  
13 roadside stop race data for analysis agency shall collect roadside stop data,  
14 including the age, gender, race, and ethnicity of drivers. Law enforcement  
15 agencies shall work with the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council with  
16 the goals of collecting uniform data, adopting uniform storage methods and  
17 periods, and ensuring that data can be analyzed. Reports and analysis of  
18 roadside stop data shall be public. The data itself shall not be released along  
19 with the name or other identifying information of the driver, except that a  
20 driver shall be entitled to obtain roadside stop data pertaining to himself or

1 herself in the course of a civil or criminal proceeding to which the driver is a  
2 party.

3 Second: By inserting a new section to be Sec. 3a to read:

4 Sec. 3a. 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(B) is amended to read:

5 (B) Notwithstanding subdivision (A) of this subdivision (5), records  
6 relating to management and direction of a law enforcement agency; records  
7 reflecting the initial arrest of a person, including any ticket, citation, or  
8 complaint issued for a traffic violation, as that term is defined in 23 V.S.A.  
9 § 2302; and records reflecting the charge of a person shall be public.

10 However, roadside stop data as described in 20 V.S.A. § 2366(e) shall either be  
11 deidentified or redacted prior to release of any ticket, citation, or complaint  
12 arising from a traffic stop if required under 20 V.S.A. § 2366(e);
