13	and the outcome of the stop. Law enforcement agencies shall work with the
14	Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council with the goals of collecting
15	uniform data, adopting uniform storage methods and periods, and ensuring that
16	data can be analyzed. Roadside stop data, as well as reports and analysis of
17	roadside stop data, shall be public.
