1	Subject: Motor vehicles; vulnerable users; bicyclists; passing; turning; bicycle
2	lanes
3	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
4	operators of motor vehicles:
5	(1) pass vulnerable users at specified distances depending on the
6	operator's speed;
7	(2) refrain from driving to the left side of the center of a roadway to pass
8	a vehicle or vulnerable user unless the left side is clearly visible and free of
9	oncoming traffic and vulnerable users for a sufficient distance to permit safe
10	overtaking and passing and unless passing can be accomplished without
11	interfering with the operation of any vehicle or with any vulnerable user; and
12	(3) yield to vulnerable users when turning.
13	An act relating to passing and yielding to vulnerable users
14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1033 is amended to read:
16	§ 1033. PASSING MOTOR VEHICLES AND VULNERABLE USERS
17	(a) Passing motor vehicles. Motor vehicles proceeding in the same
18	direction may be overtaken and passed only as follows:
19	(1) The driver of a motor vehicle overtaking another motor vehicle
20	proceeding in the same direction may pass to its left at a safe distance, and
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when so doing shall exercise due care, shall not pass to the left of the center of
the highway unless the way ahead is clear of approaching traffic <u>or vulnerable</u>
<u>users</u>, and shall not again drive to the right side of the roadway until safely
clear of the overtaken vehicle.

5 (2) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the 6 driver of an overtaken motor vehicle shall give way to the right in favor of the 7 overtaking motor vehicle on audible signal and shall not increase the speed of 8 his or her vehicle until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle.

9 (b) Passing vulnerable users. The operator of a motor vehicle approaching 10 or passing a vulnerable user as defined in subdivision 4(81) of this title shall 11 exercise due care, which includes increasing clearance, to pass the vulnerable 12 user safely, and shall cross the center of the highway only as provided in 13 subdivision (a)(1) of this section and section 1035 of this title. An operator 14 shall be presumed to be exercising due care when operating the motor vehicle 15 completely in the adjacent lane, or when allowing a clearance of at least three 16 feet when the motor vehicle is traveling at 30 miles per hour or less and at least 17 one additional foot of clearance for every 10 miles per hour above 30 miles per 18 hour.

- 2 § 1035. LIMITATIONS

(a) No vehicle shall be driven to the left side of the center of the roadway in 3 4 overtaking and passing another vehicle or a vulnerable user proceeding in the 5 same direction unless authorized by the provisions of this chapter and unless 6 the left side is clearly visible and free of oncoming traffic and vulnerable users 7 for a sufficient distance ahead to permit overtaking and passing to be 8 completed without interfering with the operation of any vehicle or with any 9 vulnerable user approaching from the opposite direction or with the operation 10 of any vehicle or with any vulnerable user overtaken. In every event the 11 overtaking vehicle shall return to an authorized lane of travel as soon as 12 practicable and, if the passing movement involves the use of a lane authorized 13 for vehicles approaching from the opposite direction, before coming within 14 200 feet of any approaching vehicle or vulnerable user. 15 (b) A vehicle shall not pass another vehicle or vulnerable user from the rear 16 under any of the following conditions: 17 (1) When approaching or upon the crest of a grade or upon a curve in 18 the highway where the driver's view is in any way obstructed; 19 (2) When approaching within 100 feet of, or traversing, any intersection 20 or railroad grade crossing unless otherwise indicated by official traffic control 21 devices; or

7	§ 1022. TRAFFIC-CONTROL SIGNALS
8	(a) Whenever traffic is controlled by traffic-control signals exhibiting
9	different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows, successively one at a time or
10	in combination, only the colors green, red, and yellow may be used, except for
11	special pedestrian signals carrying a word legend, and the signals shall indicate
12	and apply to drivers and pedestrians vulnerable users as follows:
13	(1) Green signal:
14	(A) Vehicular traffic facing a circular green signal may proceed
15	straight through or turn right or left unless a sign prohibits either turn.
16	Vehicular traffic, including vehicles turning right or left, shall yield the right of
17	way to other vehicles and vulnerable users or to pedestrians lawfully within the
18	intersection or on an adjacent crosswalk at the time the signal is exhibited.
19	(B) Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal, shown alone or in
20	combination with another signal, may cautiously enter the intersection only to
21	make the movement indicated by the arrow, or such other movement as is

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1	permitted by other signals shown at the same time. Vehicular traffic shall
2	yield the right of way to pedestrians lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk or
3	to other traffic, including vulnerable users, lawfully using the intersection.
4	(C) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control signal, as
5	provided in section 1023 of this title, pedestrians facing a green signal may
6	proceed across the roadway within any marked or unmarked crosswalk, but not
7	when the sole green signal is a turn arrow.

9	(3) Steady red signal:
10	(A) Vehicular traffic facing a steady circular red signal alone shall
11	stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, shall stop before entering the
12	crosswalk on the near side of the intersection.
13	(B) Except when a sign is in place prohibiting a turn, vehicular traffic
14	facing any steady red signal may cautiously enter the intersection to turn right,
15	or to turn left from a one way street into a one way street, after stopping as
16	required by subdivision (A) of this subdivision. This traffic shall yield the
17	right-of-way to pedestrians lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk and to other
18	traffic, including vulnerable users, lawfully using the intersection. No motorist
19	shall turn right when facing a red arrow signal indication unless a regulatory
20	sign is present which permits this movement.

7	The driver of a vehicle intending to turn to the left within an intersection or
8	into an alley, private road, or driveway shall yield the right of way to any
9	vehicle approaching from the opposite direction which is either within the
10	intersection or <u>or vulnerable user</u> so close as to constitute an immediate hazard
11	present a risk of collision.
12	Sec. 5. 23 V.S.A. § 1048 is amended to read:
13	§ 1048. STOP OR YIELD INTERSECTIONS
14	(a) Preferential right of way at an intersection may be indicated by "stop"
15	signs or "yield" signs.
16	(b) Except when directed to proceed by an enforcement officer or
17	traffic-control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection
18	indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none,
19	before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or, if none,
20	then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view
21	of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the

1 intersection. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right of way to 2 any vehicle which has entered, or to any vulnerable user who has entered the 3 intersection from another highway or which is approaching so closely on said 4 highway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when such driver 5 is moving across or within the intersection. 6 (c) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign shall in obedience to 7 the yield sign slow down to a speed reasonable for the existing conditions and, 8 if required for safety to stop, shall stop before entering the crosswalk on the 9 near side of the intersection, or, if none, then at the point nearest the 10 intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the 11 intersecting roadway. After slowing or stopping, the driver shall yield the right 12 of way to any vehicle or to any vulnerable user in the intersection or 13 approaching on another highway so closely as to constitute an immediate 14 hazard during the time the driver is moving across or within the intersection. 15 However, if If the driver is involved in a collision with a vehicle or vulnerable 16 user in the intersection, after driving past a yield sign without stopping, the 17 collision shall be deemed prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield 18 right of way.
