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(2)(A) Upon early retirement, a group F member, except facility employees of the Department of Corrections and Department of Corrections employees who provide direct security and treatment services to offenders under supervision in the community and Woodside facility employees, shall receive an early retirement allowance which shall be equal to the normal retirement allowance reduced by one-half of one percent for each month the member is under age 62 years of age at the time of early retirement. Group F members who have 20 years of service as facility employees of the Department of Corrections, as Department of Corrections employees who provide direct security and treatment services to offenders under supervision in the

community or as Woodside facility employees, dispatchers in the Department
of Public Safety, or as Vermont State Hospital employees, or as employees of
its successor in interest, who provide direct patient care shall receive an early
retirement allowance which shall be equal to the normal retirement allowance
at age 55 years of age without reduction; provided the 20 years of service
occurred in one or more of the following capacities as an employee of the
Department of Corrections, Woodside facility, <u>dispatchers in the Department</u>
of Public Safety, or the Vermont State Hospital, or its successor in interest:
facility employee, community service center employee, or court and reparative
service unit employee.
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Sec. 2. EARLY RETIREMENT; STUDY COMMITTEE; REPORT
(a) Creation. There is created an Early Retirement Study Committee to
study the issue of early retirement benefits for the employees described in
subsection (c) of this section.
(b) Membership. The Early Retirement Study Committee shall be
composed of the following nine members:
(1) one current member of the House of Representatives, who shall be
appointed by the Speaker of the House;
(2) one current member of the Senate, who shall be appointed by the
President Pro Tempore;

1	(3) four members appointed by the Vermont State Employees
2	Association;
3	(4) the State Treasurer or his or her designee;
4	(5) the Commissioner of Human Resources or his or her designee; and
5	(6) one member appointed by the State Treasurer.
6	(c) Powers and duties.
7	(1) The Committee shall study the issue of early retirement benefits for
8	each of the following types of employees:
9	(A) employees of the Department of Corrections;
10	(B) employees of the Woodside facility;
11	(C) dispatchers in the Department of Public Safety;
12	(D) direct care providers at the Vermont Veterans' Home; and
13	(E) the following types of employees of the Vermont State Hospital:
14	(i) facility employees;
15	(ii) community service center employees; and
16	(iii) court and reparative service unit employees.
17	(2) In studying the issue of early retirement benefits for the employees
18	set forth in subdivision (1) of this subsection, the Committee shall examine:
19	(A) each of those types of employees independently and not on the
20	basis of providing early retirement benefits to all of those types of employees;
21	(B) existing retirement laws and proposed legislation in other states;

1	(C) the appropriateness and legality of mandatory retirement; and
2	(D) any other issues relevant to early retirement benefits.
3	(d) Assistance. The Committee shall have the administrative, technical,
4	and legal assistance of the Office of Legislative Council and the Joint Fiscal
5	Office.
6	(e) Report. On or before January 15, 2015, the Committee shall submit a
7	written report to the Senate and House Committees on Government Operations
8	with its findings and any recommendations for legislative action.
9	(f) Meetings.
10	(1) The State Treasurer or his or her designee shall be the Chair of the
11	Committee.
12	(2) The Committee shall convene on or before September 1, 2014 at the
13	call of the Chair and the Chair shall call any subsequent meetings.
14	(3)(A) A majority of the members of the Committee shall be physically
15	present at the same location to constitute a quorum.
16	(B) A member may vote only if physically present at the meeting
17	location.
18	(C) Action shall be taken only if there is both a quorum and a
19	majority vote of the members physically present and voting.
20	(4) The Committee shall cease to exist on the date it submits its report
21	under subsection (e) of this section.

1	(g) Reimbursement.
2	(1) For attendance at meetings during adjournment of the General
3	Assembly, legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem
4	compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406.
5	(2) Other members of the Committee who are not employees of the State
6	of Vermont and who are not otherwise compensated or reimbursed for their
7	attendance shall be entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement of
8	expenses pursuant to 32 V.S.A. § 1010.
9	Sec. 3. REPORT; STATE TREASURER; EFFECT OF SEC. 1
10	After five years have passed since the effective date of Sec. 1 of this act and
11	on or before January 15, 2020, the State Treasurer shall report to the Senate
12	and House Committees on Government Operations regarding any effect
13	Sec. 1 of this act had on the retention of dispatchers in the Department of
14	Public Safety.
15	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
16	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
