SUBJECT: Changes to make in the teacher relicensing process

Vermont-NEA is seeking to change the current relicensing process by:

- 1. Removing, as of July 1, 2014, the obligations to develop an IPLP (individual professional learning plan) and portfolio
- 2. <u>Retaining</u> all other current components of the process (primarily all continuing education obligations, any attestation required, and fee payment)
- 3. <u>Working in collaboration</u> with the Standards Board for Professional Educators and Agency of Education to improve the process otherwise so that it contributes to a teachers' professional growth

Only item 1 above requires either legislation or a quick administrative decision.

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**If** legislation is needed, it could read as follows, as drafted in February by Legislative Council:

Sec. \_\_\_. EDUCATOR LICENSE RENEWAL; INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL LEARNING PLAN

- (a) Notwithstanding any Rules Governing the Licensing of Educators (Rules) adopted by the Vermont Standards Board for Professional Educators (Board) to the contrary, the renewal of a Professional Educator's License shall not require or be based upon the development, identification, evaluation, or self-evaluation of an Individual Professional Learning Plan, a professional portfolio, or professional learning goals. The Board may require an applicant to document completion of a certain number of hours or credits of professional learning; provided, however, that an applicant shall not be required to identify or affirm a connection between the learning and the applicant's unique professional goals.
- (b) On or before **[DATE]**, the Board shall adopt amended rules to conform to this section.
- (c) This section shall apply to applications for renewal filed on or after July 1, 2014.
