Whereas, it is widely recognized and accepted that persons with disabilities can and are motivated to work, and

Whereas, current assistive technology and other advancements allow persons with disabilities to be employed, in integrated settings, as productive citizens, and

Whereas, the increased socioeconomic productivity resulting from persons with disabilities entering the work force can only benefit all of society, and

Whereas, the elimination of employment disincentives for persons with disabilities would reduce entitlement payments and dependency upon public assistance programs, and

Whereas, the theme of Vermont's Disability Awareness Day 2016 is "Let's Get to Work!", now therefore be it

## Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly recognizes the special employment challenges that exist for persons with disabilities and designates March 23, 2016 as Disability Awareness Day at the State House, and be it further
