An act relating to the membership of the Commission on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

Sec. 1. 3 V.S.A. § 3085b is amended to read:

§ 3085b. COMMISSION ON ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED DISORDERS

- (a) The Commission on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders is created.
- (b) The Commission shall be composed of 47 20 members: the Commissioner Commissioners of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living and of Health or a designee designees, one Senator chosen by the Committee on Committees of the Senate, one Representative chosen by the Speaker of the House, and 14 16 members appointed by the Governor. The members appointed by the Governor shall represent the following groups and organizations: physicians, social workers, nursing home managers, the clergy, adult day center providers, the business community, registered nurses, residential care home operators, family care providers, the home health agency, the legal profession, mental health service providers, the area agencies on aging, University of Vermont's Center on Aging, the Support and Services at Home (SASH) program, and the Alzheimer's Association. The members

appointed by the Governor shall represent, to the degree possible, the five regions of the State.

- (c) Members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of three years and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. A member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be appointed only for the unexpired portion of the term.
- (d) Legislative members shall be entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in 2 V.S.A. § 406 for no more than six meetings per year; the remaining members shall be entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for no more than six meetings per year. Payment to legislative members shall be from the appropriation to the Legislature. Payment to the remaining members shall be from the appropriation to the Department of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living.

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(h) Annually, on or before January 15, the Commission shall submit a
written report to the House Committee on Human Services and to the Senate
Committee on Health and Welfare with its findings and any recommendations
for legislative action.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect on passage.
