13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 9 V.S.A. § 2454a is added to read:
15	§ 2454a. CONSUMER CONTRACTS; AUTOMATIC RENEWAL
16	(a) A contract between a consumer and a seller or a lessor shall not
17	automatically renew upon termination unless:
18	(1) the contract states the terms of the automatic renewal provision in
19	plain, unambiguous language;

1	(2) the consumer takes an additional, affirmative action to opt in to the
2	automatic renewal provision; and
3	(3) if the consumer accepts the automatic renewal provision, the seller
4	or lessor provides a written or electronic notice to the consumer at least
5	30 days but not more than 60 days before the termination date that includes:
6	(A) the date the contract will terminate and a clear statement that
7	unless the consumer cancels the contract as of the termination date it will
8	renew automatically;
9	(B) the length and any additional terms of the renewal period;
10	(C) one or more methods by which the consumer can cancel the
11	contract; and
12	(D) contact information for the seller or lessor.
13	(b) A person who violates a provision of subsection (a) of this section
14	commits an unfair and deceptive act in commerce in violation of section 2453
15	of this title.
