6	Subject: Motor vehicles; vulnerable users; bicyclists; passing; turning; bicycle
7	lanes
8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to:
9	(1) specify circumstances when motor vehicle operators shall be
10	presumed to be exercising due care in passing vulnerable users;
11	(2) prohibit motor vehicle operators from driving to the left side of the
12	center of a roadway to pass a vehicle or vulnerable user unless the left side is
13	clearly visible and free of oncoming traffic and vulnerable users for a sufficient
14	distance to permit safe overtaking and passing and unless passing can be
15	accomplished without interfering with the operation of any vehicle or with any
16	vulnerable user; and
17	(3) require motor vehicle operators to yield to vulnerable users when
18	turning.

20 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1033 is amended to read:
2	§ 1033. PASSING MOTOR VEHICLES AND VULNERABLE USERS
3	(a) Passing motor vehicles. Motor vehicles proceeding in the same
4	direction may be overtaken and passed only as follows:
5	(1) The driver of a motor vehicle overtaking another motor vehicle
6	proceeding in the same direction may pass to its left at a safe distance, and
7	when so doing shall exercise due care, shall not pass to the left of the center of
8	the highway unless the way ahead is clear of approaching traffic and
9	vulnerable users, and shall not again drive to the right side of the roadway until
10	safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.
11	(2) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the
12	driver of an overtaken motor vehicle shall give way to the right in favor of the
13	overtaking motor vehicle on audible signal and shall not increase the speed of
14	his or her vehicle until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle.
15	(b) Passing vulnerable users. The operator of a motor vehicle approaching
16	or passing a vulnerable user as defined in subdivision 4(81) of this title shall
17	exercise due care, which includes increasing clearance, to pass the vulnerable
18	user safely, and shall cross the center of the highway only as provided in
19	subdivision (a)(1) of this section and section 1035 of this title. An operator
20	shall be presumed to be exercising due care when operating the motor vehicle
21	completely in the adjacent lane, or when allowing a clearance of at least three

1	feet when the motor vehicle is traveling at 30 miles per hour or less and at least
2	one additional foot of clearance for every 10 miles per hour above 30 miles per
3	<u>hour</u> .

5	§ 1035. LIMITATIONS
6	(a) No vehicle shall be driven to the left side of the center of the roadway in
7	overtaking and passing another vehicle or a vulnerable user proceeding in the
8	same direction unless authorized by the provisions of this chapter and unless
9	the left side is clearly visible and free of oncoming traffic and vulnerable users
10	for a sufficient distance ahead to permit overtaking and passing to be
11	completed without interfering with the operation of any vehicle or with any
12	vulnerable user approaching from the opposite direction or with the operation
13	of any vehicle or with any vulnerable user overtaken. In every event, the
14	overtaking vehicle shall return to an authorized lane of travel as soon as
15	practicable and, if the passing movement involves the use of a lane authorized
16	for vehicles approaching from the opposite direction, before coming within
17	200 feet of any approaching vehicle or vulnerable user.
18	(b) A vehicle shall not pass another <u>vehicle or vulnerable user</u> from the rear
19	under any of the following conditions:
20	(1) when approaching or upon the crest of a grade or upon a curve in the
21	highway where the driver's view is in any way obstructed;

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1	(2) when approaching within 100 feet of, or traversing, any intersection
2	or railroad grade crossing unless otherwise indicated by official traffic control
3	devices; or
4	(3) when the view is obstructed upon approaching within 100 feet of any
5	bridge, viaduct, or tunnel.
6	(c) The foregoing limitations do not apply upon a one-way roadway, or
7	when subdivision 1031(a)(2) of this title applies, or where a vehicle is turning
8	left into an alley, private road, or driveway.

10	§ 1022. TRAFFIC-CONTROL SIGNALS
11	(a) Whenever traffic is controlled by traffic-control signals exhibiting
12	different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows, successively one at a time or
13	in combination, only the colors green, red, and yellow may be used, except for
14	special pedestrian signals carrying a word legend, and the signals shall indicate
15	and apply to drivers and pedestrians vulnerable users as follows:
16	(1) Green signal:
17	(A) Vehicular traffic facing a circular green signal may proceed
18	straight through or turn right or left unless a sign prohibits either turn.
19	Vehicular traffic, including vehicles turning right or left, shall yield the right of
20	way to other vehicles and vulnerable users or to pedestrians lawfully within the
21	intersection or on an adjacent crosswalk at the time the signal is exhibited.

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1	(B) Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal, shown alone or in
2	combination with another signal, may cautiously enter the intersection only to
3	make the movement indicated by the arrow, or such other movement as is
4	permitted by other signals shown at the same time. Vehicular traffic shall
5	yield the right of way to pedestrians lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk or
6	to other traffic or vulnerable users lawfully using the intersection.
7	(C) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control signal, as
8	provided in section 1023 of this title, pedestrians facing a green signal may
9	proceed across the roadway within any marked or unmarked crosswalk, but not
10	when the sole green signal is a turn arrow.

8	§ 1047. VEHICLE TURNING LEFT —GENERAL DUTY TO YIELD
9	The driver of a vehicle intending to turn to the left within an intersection or
10	into an alley, private road, or driveway shall yield the right of way to any
11	vehicle approaching from the opposite direction which is either within the
12	intersection or <u>or vulnerable user</u> so close as to <del>constitute an immediate hazard</del>
13	present a risk of collision.
14	Sec. 5. 23 V.S.A. § 1048 is amended to read:
15	§ 1048. STOP OR YIELD INTERSECTIONS
16	(a) Preferential right of way at an intersection may be indicated by "stop"
17	signs or "yield" signs.
18	(b) Except when directed to proceed by an enforcement officer or
19	traffic-control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection
20	indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none,
21	before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or, if none,

1	then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view
2	of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the
3	intersection. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right of way to
4	any vehicle which has entered or to any vulnerable user who has entered the
5	intersection from another highway or which is approaching so closely on said
6	the highway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when such
7	the driver is moving across or within the intersection.
8	(c) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign shall in obedience to
9	the yield sign slow down to a speed reasonable for the existing conditions and,
10	if required for safety to stop, shall stop before entering the crosswalk on the
11	near side of the intersection, or, if none, then at the point nearest the
12	intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the
13	intersecting roadway. After slowing or stopping, the driver shall yield the right
14	of way to any vehicle and to any vulnerable user in the intersection or
15	approaching on another highway so closely as to constitute an immediate
16	hazard present a risk of collision during the time the driver is moving across or
17	within the intersection. However, if If the driver is involved in a collision with
18	a vehicle or vulnerable user in the intersection, after driving past a yield sign
19	without stopping, the collision shall be deemed prima facie evidence of the
20	driver's failure to yield right of way.
