5 Subject: Education; school buildings; lighting; State Board of Education; rules

6 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill amends the State Board of

7 Education Manual of Rules and Practices on lighting requirements for artificial

8 illumination installed as part of a school construction project and requires the

9 State Board to conform this amendment to the published version of the rules.

10 An act relating to amending the State Board of Education rules on school  
11 lighting requirements

12 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

13 Sec. 1. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION; RULES; LIGHTING

14 (a) In the State Board of Education Manual of Rules and Practices, Rule

15 6140 (Lighting), the language is struck and the following is inserted in lieu

16 thereof to read:

17 “In all classrooms or other areas where instruction routinely takes place,

18 the artificial illumination installed as part of a school construction project shall

19 conform to the illumination guidelines for special applications or other areas as

1 described by the most recent edition of the Illuminating Engineering Society of  
2 North America Lighting Handbook.”

(b) On or before ~~August 1, 2015~~ *August 1, 2016*, the State Board of  
Education shall conform the published version of the rules described in this  
section to the requirements of subsection (a) of this section. Provided that the  
only revision to those rules is the change required by subsection (a) of this  
section, the rulemaking procedures of the Vermont Administrative Procedure  
Act shall not apply to the publication of this conformed version of the rules.  
However, on publication, the Board shall send a copy of the conformed version  
of the rules to the Office of the Secretary of State and the Legislative  
Committee on Administrative Rules.
