6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to authorize the
7	Department of Motor Vehicles to issue eight-year operator licenses and
8	nondriver identification cards.
9	An act relating to eight-year driver's licenses and identification cards
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 115 is amended to read:
12	§ 115. NONDRIVER IDENTIFICATION CARDS
13	(a) Any Vermont resident may make application to the Commissioner and
14	be issued an identification card which is attested by the Commissioner as to
15	true name, correct age, residential address unless the listing of another address
16	is requested by the applicant or is otherwise authorized by law, and any other
17	identifying data as the Commissioner may require which shall include, in the
18	case of minor applicants, the written consent of the applicant's parent,
19	guardian, or other person standing in loco parentis. Every application for an

identification card shall be signed by the applicant and shall contain such

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evidence of age and identity as the Commissioner may require, consistent with
subsection (l) of this section. New and renewal application forms shall include
a space for the applicant to request that a "veteran" designation by placed on
his or her identification card. If a veteran, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(2),
requests a veteran designation and provides a Department of Defense Form
214 or other proof of veteran status specified by the Commissioner, and the
Office of Veterans Affairs confirms his or her status as an honorably
discharged veteran or a veteran discharged under honorable conditions, the
identification card shall include the term "veteran" on its face. The
Commissioner shall require payment of a fee of \$20.00 at the time application
for an identification card is made in the case of four-year cards and of \$35.00
in the case of eight-year cards, except that an initial nondriver identification
card shall be issued at no charge to a person who surrenders his or her license
in connection with a suspension or revocation under subsection 636(b) of this
title due to a physical or mental condition.
(b) Every identification card shall expire, unless earlier canceled, on the
fourth birthday of the applicant following the date of original issue <u>in the case</u>
of four-year cards, and on the eighth birthday of the applicant following the
date of original issue in the case of eight-year cards, and may be renewed every
four years upon payment of a \$20.00 fee or every eight years for a \$35.00 fee.

At least 30 days before an identification card will expire, the Commissioner

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1	shall mail first class to the cardholder an application to renew the identification
2	card.

4	(j) Persons receiving Supplemental Security Income or Social Security
5	Disability Income and persons with a disability as defined in 9 V.S.A.
6	§ 4501(2) shall be provided with nondriver identification cards for the
7	following fees:
8	(1) Original issuance of a four-year card: \$10.00. Original issuance of
9	an eight-year card: \$15.00.
10	(2) Renewal every four years: \$10.00. Renewal every eight years:

15	surrendered in connection with an application for an identification card. In

20	(2) one-quarter of the four-year fee established by subsection 601(c)

5	(b) All operator licenses issued under this chapter shall expire at midnight
6	on the eve of the second of, fourth, or eighth anniversary of the date of birth of
7	the applicant following the date they were issued. All junior operator licenses
8	shall expire at midnight on the eve of the second anniversary of the date of
9	birth of the applicant following the date they were issued. A person born on
10	February 29 shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered as born on
11	March 1.

13	§ 608. FEES; REFUND FOR SURRENDERED LICENSE OR PRIVILEGE
14	CARD
15	(a)(1) The fee for an eight-year operator's license shall be \$91.00.
16	Operator's privilege cards shall not be issued for an eight-year period. The
17	four-year fee required to be paid the Commissioner for licensing an operator of
18	motor vehicles or for issuing an operator's privilege card shall be \$48.00. The
19	two-year fee required to be paid the Commissioner for licensing an operator or

for issuing an operator's privilege card shall be \$30.00 and the two-year fee for

1	licensing a junior operator or for issuing a junior operator's privilege card shall
2	be \$30.00.
3	(2) A person who surrenders a license or privilege card at least one year
4	prior to its expiration shall be entitled to a refund from monies paid to the
5	Treasury by the Department, as follows:
6	(A) For a two-year license or privilege card, the refund shall be
7	one-half of the two-year fee paid, less a \$5.00 processing charge.
8	(B) For a four-year operator license or privilege card, the refund shall
9	be one-fourth of the four-year fee paid for each remaining full year of validity,
10	less a \$5.00 processing charge.
11	(C) For an eight-year operator license, the refund shall be one-eighth
12	of the eight-year fee paid for each remaining full year of validity, less a \$5.00
13	processing charge.
14	(b) An additional fee of \$2.00 per year shall be paid for a motorcycle
15	endorsement. The endorsement may be obtained for either a two-year or,
16	four-year, or eight-year period, to be coincidental with the length of the
17	operator's license.
