7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require retail
8	establishments to allow a customer with an inflammatory bowel disease to use
9	an employee restroom when a public restroom is not immediately accessible.
10 11	An act relating to access to employee restrooms for individuals living with an inflammatory bowel disease
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 1311 is added to read:
14	§ 1311. RESTROOM ACCESS; INFLAMMATORY BOWEL DISEASE
15	(a) As used in this section:
16	(1) "Customer" means a member of the public who is lawfully on the
17	premises of a retail establishment.
18	(2) "Eligible medical condition" means Crohn's disease, ulcerative
19	colitis, any other inflammatory bowel disease, irritable bowel syndrome, or any
20	other medical condition that requires immediate access to a restroom.

BILL AS INTRODUCED 2016

1	(3) "Employee restroom" means a restroom intended for only the
2	employees of a retail facility and not for customers.
3	(4) "Retail establishment" means a place of business open to the general
4	public for the sale of goods or services.
5	(b) A retail establishment that has an employee restroom shall allow a
6	customer to use that restroom during normal business hours if all of the
7	following conditions are met:
8	(1) The customer requesting the use of the employee restroom has an
9	eligible medical condition or uses an ostomy device and offers a physician's
10	note indicating the eligible medical condition or device.
11	(2) The retail establishment does not have a public restroom that is
12	immediately accessible to the customer.
13	(3) The employee restroom is not located in an area where providing
14	access would create an obvious health or safety risk to the customer or an
15	obvious security risk to the establishment.
16	(4) At the time the request for access to the employee restroom is made,
17	three or more employees of the retail establishment are working.
18	(c) A retail establishment or an employee of a retail establishment is not
19	civilly liable for any act or omission in allowing a customer meeting the
20	conditions in subsection (b) of this section to use an employee restroom if the
21	act or omission:

- 1 (1) is not willful or grossly negligent;
- 2 (2) occurs in an area of the retail establishment that is not accessible to
- 3 <u>the public; and</u>
- 4 (3) results in injury to or death of the customer or any individual other
- 5 <u>than the employee accompanying the customer.</u>
- 6 (d) An employee of a retail establishment who refuses to provide access to
- 7 <u>an employee restroom to a customer with an eligible medical condition or</u>
- 8 ostomy device and who offers a physician's note pursuant to this section shall
- 9 <u>be fined not more than \$500.00.</u>
