13	self-administers the lethal dose of medication pursuant to this chapter. The
14	independent third party shall be an individual who is not an interested person
15	as defined in section 5281 of this chapter.
16	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on passage and shall apply to requests for

18 <u>medication to hasten death made on or after that date.</u>
