(25) Sales of agricultural machinery and equipment for use and consumption directly and exclusively, except for isolated or occasional uses, <u>predominately</u> in the production for sale of tangible personal property on farms (including stock, dairy, poultry, fruit, and truck farms), orchards, nurseries, or in greenhouses or other similar structures used primarily for the raising of agricultural or horticultural commodities for sale. It shall be rebuttably presumed that uses are not isolated or occasional if they total more than four percent of the time the machinery or equipment is operated. As used in this subdivision, the term "predominately" means 75 percent or more of the time the machinery or equipment is in use.

1	Sec. 2. PURPOSE
2	This act replaces the requirement that an item be used "directly" or "directly
3	and exclusively" in the production for sale of tangible personal property on
4	farms in order to qualify for a sales and use tax exemption with a requirement
5	that the item be used "predominately" in the production for sale of tangible
6	personal property on farms in order to qualify for an exemption. The changes
7	also remove the requirement that machinery and equipment be used 96 percent
8	of the time for farming purposes in order to be exempt. It is the intention of
9	the General Assembly to clarify that certain agricultural items are exempt from

- 1 Vermont's sales and use tax, including items that are used less than 96 percent
- 2 <u>of the time for farming.</u>
