9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

11	§ 1122. EXEMPTIONS
12	(a) Notwithstanding subsections 1121(a) and (b) of this title, a person may
13	remain in school or in the a child care facility without a required
14	immunization:
15	(1) If the person or, in the case of a minor, the person's parent or
16	guardian presents a form created by the department Department and signed by
17	a licensed health care practitioner authorized to prescribe vaccines or a health
18	clinic stating that the person is in the process of being immunized. The person
19	may continue to attend school or the a child care facility for up to six months

while the immunization process is being accomplished;

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1	(2) If a health care practitioner, licensed to practice in Vermont and
2	authorized to prescribe vaccines, certifies in writing that a specific
3	immunization is or may be detrimental to the person's health or is not
4	appropriate, provided that when a particular vaccine is no longer
5	contraindicated, the person shall be required to receive the vaccine; or.
6	(3) If the person or, in the case of a minor, the person's parent or
7	guardian annually provides a signed statement to the school or child care
8	facility on a form created by the Vermont department of health Department
9	that the person, parent, or guardian:
10	(A) holds religious beliefs or philosophical convictions opposed to
11	immunization; and
12	(B) has reviewed and understands evidence-based educational
13	material provided by the department of health Department regarding
14	immunizations, including:
15	(i) information about the risks of adverse reactions to
16	immunization;
17	(C)(ii) understands information that failure to complete the
18	required vaccination schedule increases risk to the person and others of
19	contracting or carrying a vaccine-preventable infectious disease; and
20	(D)(iii) understands information that there are persons with special
21	health needs attending schools and child care facilities who are unable to be

1	vaccinated or who are at heightened risk of contracting a vaccine-preventable
2	communicable disease and for whom such a disease could be life-threatening.

5	§ 1124. ACCESS TO AND REPORTING OF IMMUNIZATION RECORDS
6	(a) In addition to any data collected in accordance with the requirements of
7	the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Vermont department of
8	health Department shall annually collect from schools the immunization rates
9	for at least those students in the first and eighth grades for each required
10	vaccine. The data collected by the department Department shall include the
11	number of medical, philosophical, and religious exemptions filed for each
12	required vaccine and the number of students with a provisional admittance.
